**Prefatory Remarks**

Little more than a century has passed since the first drug periodical was established in the United States. Just four years after the founding of the first College of Pharmacy in the United States in 1821, namely, the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy, the founders of this institution further promoted their profession by establishing the first drug periodical in this country under the title of the Philadelphia Journal of Pharmacy, which journal was established in 1825. The title, however, was changed in 1835 to American Journal of Pharmacy and under this title the journal still continues publication, ranking among the foremost American drug publications of our day.

Since the establishment of this journal, the drug periodicals of the United States have increased with the increase in population and expansion of territory and commerce, until their number totals several hundred.

To my knowledge, the first attempt to organize a history of American Pharmaceutical Journals was made by Dr. Frederick Hoffmann in 1900 when he published "A Century of American Pharmaceutical Literature and Journalism." In 1917, Herman Reif, a student at the University of Wisconsin, wrote a thesis on American Pharmaceutical Journalism, and again in 1924, A. G. Phillips, also a student at the University of Wisconsin, brought this material up to date in a thesis of the same title. Thus, as far as the writer is aware, this is the fourth attempt of this kind.

The source of my information for this subject has been the Union List of Serials which includes all periodicals published up to 1924 and which source I have designated by number "1" in the body of this thesis; The Union List of Serials Supplement which brings the publications up to date and is designated by number "4"; The files of the Pharmaceutical Library which contain copies of many of the periodicals included in this thesis and correspondence with various persons well acquainted with pharmaceutical literature in their respective states, together with correspondence from many of the journals themselves. This source is designated by number "2"; Hoffmann's A Century of American Pharmaceutical Literature and Journalism, which source is designated by number "3"; and lastly, the journals themselves were consulted as far as they were available. For the data on the number of drug stores in each state, the author is indebted to Edward Ireland's Masters Thesis, "The Ratio of Drug Stores to Population, A Study in Pharmaceutical Economics," written in 1928, at the University of Wisconsin.

## THE PHARMACEUTICAL JOURNALS OF THE UNITED STATES.

A PRELIMINARY REPORT BY MINNIE MEYER.

WITH PREFATORY REMARKS AND AN APPEAL FOR COÖPERATION BY EDWARD KREMERS.

As Miss Meyer points out in the introduction to her thesis<sup>1</sup> this is the fourth attempt at a history of pharmaceutical journalism in the United States. The thesis comprises 179 pages of records, tables and maps. Part I consists of a chronological list of journals that have been published at one time or another, some of which are still being published. Part II is a geographical list, and Part III an alphabetical list of journals. The latter also contains brief accounts of each journal. Part IV consists of tables giving the dates of admission of the several states to the Union, the population of each state according to the 1930 census, the dates of the first drug publication in each state, the total number of journals published at any time in its history and, finally, the number of journals published at present. The tables are supplemented by maps.

Though a fourth attempt, the manuscript makes no attempt at completeness. In order to make the record as complete as possible, the geographical list is herewith published in order that reprints thereof may be sent to representatives of each state for corrections and additions. This seems to be the only practical way, if not the only way, to get at the necessary information. The additional information thus acquired can then be transferred to the other chapters which can thus be made as complete as practicable.

An account of the history of pharmaceutical journalism in all of its phases certainly ought to be worth while and it is hoped that this effort will be supported by those who have knowledge not yet recorded. It may be worth while to state that the thesis as outlined above does not represent all of the information compiled. Thus there is already available an imperfect list covering the periods of issue, *vis.*, weekly, monthly, quarterly, etc. Another list reveals proprietaryship: independent publications, house organs, journals published by pharmaceutical organizations, and those published by educational institutions.

As already pointed out material is also being collected as to the history of each journal. This, naturally, involves a record of the editors as well as an account of the type of journalism pursued by them.

In closing these introductory remarks let me appeal once more to the coöperation of each and every one who reads these lines. If he will but take his own state and send in any supplementary information he or she possesses, the task of each individual will be small, but in the aggregate the results ought to prove worth while.

### Alumni Journal

This journal was the forerunner of the New York Journal of Pharmacy. (See New York Journal of Pharmacy.)

### Alumni News Letter

This was a journal published by the Alumni Association of the Maryland College of Pharmacy about 1900.

### Alumni Report

This was the title of the Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science from 1893 to 1911. (See Bulletin of the Phil. Coll. of Pharmacy and Science.)

### American Crude Drug Harvesters' Magazine

This journal was published at Muskegon, Michigan. Only three numbers of volume one, January to March 1927, were published. (See 1)

### American Drug Clerk's Journal

This journal, published monthly by the American Drug Clerks Publishing Company at 175 Dearborn Street, Chicago, first began issue in 1887. It was a practical journal of pharmacy and collateral branches. It was edited by J.M. Eaton and L.C. Hogan.

In 1890 the title changed to Registered Pharmacist and Drug Clerks' Journal, under which title it was published until it was discontinued in 1897. O.O. Stolz and J.M. Eaton became editors after 1890. (See 1, 2, 3,)

This journal started publication in 1872 under the title of New Remedies, a quarterly retrospect of therapeutics, pharmacy and allied subjects. It was published by William Wood and Company, New York, and edited by H.C. Wood of Philadelphia. In 1873 Fred A. Castle became editor. In 1876 the journal became a monthly, with Castle still as editor and Chas. Rice as associate editor.

With volume thirteen, 1884, the title changed to American Druggist, an illustrated monthly journal of pharmacy, chemistry and materia medica. In 1892 the journal was sold by Wood and Company to a stock company, known as the American Druggists Publishing Company, with A.R. Elliott, president and general manager, E.N. Root, secretary and treasurer, and Caswell A. Mayo, editor in chief.

In April, 1893 the American Druggist consolidated with the Pharmaceutical Record and the combined journals were published under the title of American Druggist and Pharmaceutical Record until 1923 when the last part of the title was dropped and it continues at present as American Druggist. When the two journals consolidated, Caswell Mayo remained editor and Thomas J. Keenan who had been associated with Professor P.W. Bedford, editor of the Pharmaceutical Record, became associate editor. (See Vol. XLII No. 10)

American Druggist and Pharmaceutical Record

This was the title under which the American Druggist was published from 1893 to 1923. (See American Druggist)

American Druggists' Circular and Chemical Gazette

This was the title of the Druggists' Circular from 1857 to 1866. (See Druggists' Circular)

American Journal of Materia Medica

This journal was published in Chicago from 1860 to 1861. Only numbers one to four of volume one were published.

American Journal of Pharmacy

This was the first journal of pharmacy published in America. It was established as the Journal of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy in 1825, by the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy for the advancement of pharmacy and allied sciences.

The original publishing committee consisted of Samuel Jackson, Henry Troth, Solomon Temple, Ellis H. Yarnall, and Daniel B. Smith who was chairman of the committee and practically acted as editor.

Four preliminary numbers were published at irregular intervals from 1825 to 1828. When the publishing committee was reorganized in 1829 with Benjamin Ellis as editor, the journal was published at regular periods and has continued so up to the present. When the journal appeared at regular periods, consecutive numbering of the volumes was begun with the new issue and the first four numbers became known as the preliminary volume. From 1829 to 1852 the journal appeared quarterly and four numbers constituted a volume except in 1847, when five numbers were published. From 1853 to 1870 it was published bi-monthly and from that time on has appeared

monthly.

In 1835 when the publishing committee was reorganized, the title was changed to American Journal of Pharmacy. The journal has been edited by the following editors: Daniel B. Smith, 1825 to 1828; Benjamin Ellis, 1829 to 1831; Robert E. Griffith, 1831 to 1836; Joseph Carson, 1836 to 1850; William Proctor Jr., 1850 to 1871; John M. Maisch, 1871 to 1893; Henry Trimble, 1893 to 1898; Henry Kraemer, 1898 to 1917; George M. Beringer, 1917 to 1921; Ivor Griffith, 1921 to the present. (See First Centuary of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy, pages 278 to 280)

#### American Laboratory

This journal was a continuation of the Laboratory which began publication in 1873 as a monthly. When the title was changed to the above, it became a bi-monthly. (See the Laboratory). (See 3)

#### American Medical Trade Journal

This journal, published in Chicago six times a year, is the official journal of the American Medical Trade Association. It began publication in 1913. (See 2)

#### American Pharmacist

This monthly publication was a continuation of the Michigan Drug News which was discontinued in 1884 and continued, in 1885 under the above title. It was published in Detroit by Charles Wright in the interest of the retail druggist. Six volumes were published, the journal being discontinued

in 1890.

This journal should not be confused with a journal of the same title published in New York in 1882. A journal of the same title is published in California at present.

(See 1,3)

#### American Pharmacist

This journal was first published in New York in 1882 by Wm. O. Allison with J.A. Peters as editor. In 1883 it consolidated with Weekly Drug News, a journal established in 1880.

(See Weekly Drug News) , (See 3)

#### American Pharmacist

This monthly journal began publication in October, 1910 under the title of Drug Clerks' Journal. It was the official organ of the California Drug Clerks' Association. Will E. Murphy was the first editor.

In 1920 sweeping changes were made in the policies of the journal. It became more liberal in the expression of its views and changed its title to the more general name,

American Registered Pharmacists Journal.

In 1930 the title was changed to American Pharmacist and it continues at present under that title. It is now the officially designated organ of the American Registered Pharmacists Association and of its various state divisions. Fred A. Lion is the present editor. (See 2)

This was the title under which the American Pharmacist was published from 1920 to 1930. California. (See American Pharmacist)

Annual Report of the Alumni Association of the College of the City of New York

(See New York Journal of Pharmacy)

Annual Report of the Alumni Association of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy

This was the title of the Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science from 1865 to 1891. (See Bulletin of the Phil. Coll. of Pharmacy and Science)

The Apothecary

This quarterly journal was published from August 1891 to June 1897. It was published by the Illinois College of Pharmacy. Number one of volume three announces publication by the School of Pharmacy of Northwestern University with which institution the Illinois College of Pharmacy had been affiliated.

The journal was devoted to pharmacy, chemistry, botany, materia medica, metrology, and to pharmaceutical progress and education. Each number consisted of no less than forty pages of original reading matter.

Oscar Oldberg, Dean of the Illinois College of Pharmacy served as editor throughout the publication of the six volumes. (See 3)

This monthly journal was launched in Boston in November, 1888 under the leadership of Mr. S.C.Ober as the New England Druggist. The first editor served but a short time and was succeeded by J.W.Colcord, with A.B.Coburn as assistant. J.H. Churchill was editor for a while in 1899. He was followed by A.B.Coburn who remained editor until the magazine passed into the hands of a new management.

During the first ten years the journal changed hands many times. In 1891 it was sold and Able G. Courtis and Benjamin F.Arrington became jointly both editors and business managers. In May, 1892 it was sold to Benjamin Johnson of the New England Grocer. A.C.Dowse was made editor. The following February brought another change with William W. Bartlett, Ph.G. taking charge. In June, 1895, still another change was made, and Wilbur Scoville, then of the Mass. Coll. of Pharmacy, became editor. In March, 1897, the journal was taken over by a corporation of druggists, with C.P.Flynn as president. The following month Joseph C.Hagar and J.O.Jordon were made assistants to Scoville. In August Mr. Hagar became editor, which position he held until he resigned in 1924.

In 1903 the title changed from the New England Druggist to the Apothecary and New England Druggists. Only volumes fifteen and sixteen (1903 to 1904) were published under the latter title. With volume Seventeen the last part of the title was dropped and the journal has continued as the Apothecary to the present time. (See November, 1928)

### The Apothecary and New England Druggist

This journal was a continuation of the New England Druggist. In 1904 the title was changed to Apothecary, under which title it has continued up to the present time. (See Apothecary)

### Apotheker Zeitung

This German pharmaceutical journal was begun in March, 1880, as a bi-monthly 'Organ fuer Apotheker, Aerzte, Chemiker und Drogisten'', published in New York. In March, 1890 it was changed to a monthly.

It was I. Plaut, the grandfather of Edward Plaut, present president of Lehn and Fink, and M. Wolffram who brought the Apotheker Zeitung into being on the Fifteenth of March, 1880. The first publishing company was the Pharmaceutical Publishing Company which in 1912 became the German Apothecaries' Publishing Company.

The editors of the journal have been Dr. George W. Rachel, H.C. Hiepe, Dr. Gustav Pfingsten, Dr. William C. Alpers, E.C. Goetting, and at present Hugo Kantrowitz and his associate editor, Wilhelm Bodemann. (See April, 1929, page 20)

### Apothescope

This quarterly journal began publication in 1929 and is the journal of the Alumni Association of the Connecticut College of Pharmacy.

### Armand Broadside

This is the house organ of the Armand Company, Des Moines,

Iowa and is published frequently by the Armand Company. It began publication in 1920 and continues up to the present. (See 2)

#### Associated Drug News

This monthly publication began publication in November, 1926. It is the official organ of the Associated Druggists of New Jersey with George I. Schreiber as editor, published at Newark, New Jersey.

#### Atoms and Molecules

The first number of this quarterly publication, published by the Alumni Association of Fordham University, appeared in January, 1921. David R. Mantell was the first editor,

#### The Bager Pharmacist

The first number of this publication appeared in March, 1930. Seven numbers have appeared. The first five numbers were published by the Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Association in the interest of its Jubilee Meeting held in Madison in July, 1930. The last two numbers were published in the interest of the Annual Meeting held at Green Lake in June, 1931. Dr. Kremers, Dean of the School of Pharmacy of the University of Wisconsin, is editor of the publication.

#### Big Four: Medicine, Pharmacy, Toxicology, Therapy

A Journal published in Kansas City, Missouri from 1897 until February, 1900, volume one to number seven of volume three being published. (See 1)

Blue and Gold Apothecary

This student publication is published semesterly by the Press Club of the University of California, College of Pharmacy, San Francisco, California. The first number appeared on April, 1932.

Boston Drug Market

This journal was first published in Boston in 1896. Five volumes were published under this title. In 1900 it was continued as Eastern Drug Market. (See Eastern Drug Market) (See 1)

Boston Journal of Chemistry

This journal was published monthly by H.O. Houghton and Company of Boston. The first issue coming out in July, 1866 as the Boston Journal of Chemistry and Pharmacy under which title it was published until May, 1867 when the title was changed to Boston Journal of Chemistry. Under the latter title it was published from July, 1867 to December, 1880.

In January, 1881 the title was changed to Boston Journal of Chemistry and Popular Science Review. It continued under this title until March, 1883 when the title changed to Popular Science News and Boston Journal of Chemistry. Under this title it was published until December, 1887.

In 1893 it was absorbed by the Oil, Paint and Drug Reporter of New York. (See Pharm. Rundschau, vol. 12, page 135)

James R. Nichols was the first editor and W.R. Rolfe, associate editor. Mr. Nichols served as editor until his death on January, 2, 1888 when his son, Austin P. Nichols

became editor.

The journal was devoted chiefly to chemistry, medicine and pharmacy being given scant space. (See 1, 2)

Boston Journal of Chemistry and Pharmacy

This preceded the Boston Journal of Chemistry and was published under the above title from July, 1866 until May, 1867 when the title was changed to Boston Journal of Chemistry. (See Boston Journal of Chemistry)

Boston Journal of Chemistry and Popular Science Review

Title of Boston Journal of Chemistry from 1881 to 1883. (See Boston Journal of Chemistry)

Bronx Pharmacist

This was a publication of the Bronx County Pharmaceutical Association. (See 2)

Buffalo Druggist

Forerunner of the Northern Druggist. (See Northern Druggist)

The Bulletin

Volume one , number one of this publication appeared at Des Moines, Iowa, January 10, 1924. It was published to advertise the Northwest Drug Exposition. (See 2)

Bulletin of Pharmacy

From 1887 to 1890 this monthly journal was published as

the Druggists' Bulletin. In 1891 the title changed to Bulletin of Pharmacy, under which title it was published until 1928 when it combined with the Western Druggist and continued as Drug Bulletin. (See Drug Bulletin)

The first editor of the Bulletin of Pharmacy was Dr. Benjamin Wood Palmer. In the spring or summer of 1893 he was succeeded by Charles B. Kirkland whom Joseph Helfman succeeded about September, 1893. Harry B. Mason was engaged later in 1897 and soon thereafter he became associate editor. In 1907 Mason became sole editor. In November, 1914 Arthur L. Buzzell became assistant editor, later becoming editor. He has continued as editor of the Drug Bulletin. (See 2)

#### Bulletin of the College of Jersey City

This quarterly bulletin is a continuation of the Bulletin of the University of the State of New Jersey which was first published in 1913. Change of title took place in 1915.

#### Bulletin of the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy

This bulletin was first published by the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy in June 1911. E. Albro Newton was editor of volume one. Leon A. Thompson was editor of volume two. Beginning with number one of volume three ( June 1913) Theodore J. Bradley, Dean of the College, became editor and has continued up to the present.

It is a quarterly journal issued in March, June, August and December. (See 2)

Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy

This publication of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy was published from 1908 to 1910. In February, 1911, it consolidated with the Alumni Report and the combined publication became known as Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Alumni Report. (See Bulletin of the Phil. Coll. of Pharmacy and Science)

Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Alumni Report

This was the title of the Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science from 1911 to 1921. (See Bulletin of the Phil. Coll. of Pharmacy and Science)

Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science

This journal, from its beginning in 1865 until 1891, was published under the title of Annual Report of the Alumni Association of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy. In 1891 the title was changed to Philadelphia College of Pharmacy Alumni Report. In October, 1893, the first part of the title was dropped and the journal appeared as Alumni Report until February, 1911, when it consolidated with the Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and the resulting title became Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Alumni Report. Under this title it was published until 1921 when the title changed to Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science and Alumni Report. Under this latter

title the journal was published until 1925 when the last part of the title disappeared and it continues at present as Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science.

From 1865 to 1891 it was published annually; from 1891 to 1892, eight issues appeared, November to June; 1892 to 1896 nine issues each year, October to June; 1896 to 1897, eleven issues appeared; 1898 to 1910, twelve issues each year; 1911 to 1916, six issues per year; 1917 to 1929, four issues per year; since 1930 it appears monthly. (See 2 )

Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science and Alumni Report

This was the title of the Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science from 1921 to 1925. (See Bull. of the Phil. Coll. of Pharmacy and Science)

Bulletin of the United Medicine Manufacturers of America

This publication was first published in 1921. It was published in Chicago.

Bulletin of the University of the State of New Jersey

This quarterly publication, issued by the University of the State of New Jersey, was first published in 1913. In 1915 the title was changed to Bulletin of the College of Jersey City. (See Bulletin of the College of Jersey City)

California Druggist

The first number of this monthly journal, edited by R. A. Allen at Los Angeles, California, appeared in 1891. It is still being published by the California Druggist's Publishing Company as the house organ of the Brunswig Wholesale Drug Company of Los Angeles.

California Retail Drug Journal

Number one of volume one of this monthly journal appeared in November 1919. It was the official organ of the Los Angeles and Southern California Retail Druggists' Association.

In 1928 it combined with the Stirring Rod and is published as the West Coast Druggist. (See West Coast Druggist)

The Carolina Journal of Pharmacy

This journal began publication in May, 1915, as a quarterly and was the official organ of the William Simpson Pharmaceutical Society of the School of Pharmacy of the University of North Carolina.

Because of the prohibitive cost of printing during the war period, it was discontinued after the third volume. At the 1922 meeting of the North Carolina Pharmaceutical Association, Mr. Beard, who had directed the destiny of the journal, was authorized to issue a monthly journal of the same title under the auspices of the State Pharmaceutical Association. The journal has been issued regularly since that time. (See 2 )

Number one of this monthly journal appeared in March, 1919 under the title of the Journal of the Central States College of Pharmacy. Only number one and two were published under this title. with number three, May, 1919, the title changed to Central States Journal of Pharmacy.

The primary object in launching this journal was to further the present day demands for properly trained pharmacists, both as clerks and proprietors. It was a journal devoted to education, professional and commercial development of pharmacy.

It was published by the Central States College of Pharmacy, 74 East 12 th Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Chicago Drug Club Messenger

This journal began publication in 1915 and has continued up to the present.

Chicago Retail Druggists' Association Auxiliary

A monthly journal published in the interests of the Retail Druggists of Cook County, Illinois, the first number of which was published in September 1901. George A. Graves, Chicago, was chairman of the publication committee.

In 1902 the journal was continued as the Organizer. (See the Organizer)

Chicago Retail Druggists' Association News

This weekly journal published by the Chicago Retail Druggists' Association at Chicago, Illinois, first appeared

as the Chicago Retail Druggists' Association Notes, January 2, 1908. With the number of January 14 th, 1909, the title changed to Chicago Retail Druggists' Association News.

(See 2 )

#### Chicago Retail Druggists' Association Notes

This journal is the forerunner of the Chicago Retail Druggists' Association News. (See Chicago Retail Druggists' Association News)

#### Clafin's Druggist

This monthly house organ of George L. Clafin Company, Providence, Rhode Island, was first issued in 1881. It consisted chiefly of a price list. The publication was discontinued in 1914.

#### Columbia University College of Pharmacy Alumni Journal

This was the title of the New York Journal of Pharmacy from 1916 to 1917. (See New York Journal of Pharmacy)

#### Communicator

This is the publication of Phi Delta Chi fraternity, first issued in 1911. It is published four times a year, in March, May, November and January.

#### Consolidated Drug News

This publication, first issued in November, 1929, is the official organ of the C. D. S. Drug Stores. George I.

Schreiber is editor. It is published monthly at Newark, New Jersey.

Detroit Review of Medicine and Pharmacy

Eleven volumes of this monthly journal were published in Detroit, Michigan from April, 1866, to December, 1876, when the journal united with the Peninsular Journal of Medicine to form the Detroit Medical Journal, later the American Lancet.

Deutsch Amerikanische Apotheker Zeitung

Title under which Apotheker Zeitung was published from 1880 until 1918. (See Apotheker Zeitung)

Deutsch Amerikanische Pharmaceutische Zeitung

This journal was specified to be the "Central organ fuer die deutschen Apotheker Aerzte und Drogisten in den Vereinigten Staaten."

It was published by A. G. F. Streit and O. M. Hunoke, Be Belleville, Illinois, later in Okawville, Illinois, in 1875. (See 3)

Display Topics

This is the official publication of drug topics window club, devoted exclusively to druggists' window and store display. It is published in New York. (See 2)

The Disseminator

This publication, purporting to be a monthly disseminator

of news and items of interest to the retail drug trade, was first issued in August, 1908, by Meyer Brother's Drug Company of St. Louis, Missouri. A. C. Meyer was editor. The publication was discontinued in 1918. (See 2)

#### The Dixie Druggist

This was a personally owned publication of about twenty pages published in Hickory, North Carolina. It ran for only four issues, April to July, 1913, inclusive. It was "a monthly magazine for southern druggists!" (See 2)

#### Dixie Pharmaceutical Journal

This journal was published in Atlanta, Georgia from October, 1926 to March, 1928 when it combined with the Southeastern Drug Journal. (See 2)

#### Druggo News

This is the house organ of the Philadelphia Wholesale Drug Company and was first issued in 1910.

#### Drug and Chemical Markets

Title of Drug and Cosmetic Industry from 1916 to 1926.  
(See Drug and Cosmetic Industry)

#### Drug and Cosmetic Industry

This journal was established in 1914 as Weekly Drug Markets, published by D. O. Haynes and Company of New York. In 1916 the title changed to Drug and Chemical Markets.

This was also a weekly publication. In 1926 this publication became two separate journals, one under the title of Chemical Markets and the other as Drug Markets. With this separation Drug Markets became a monthly publication and has continued so up to the present.

In 1932 the title changed to Drug and Cosmetic Industry.  
(See 1 )

#### Drug Bulletin

This monthly journal is the combined publication of the Bulletin of Pharmacy and Western Druggist. It is published at Chicago, Illinois with A. L. Buzzell, former editor of the Bulletin of Pharmacy continuing as editorial writer.

#### Drug Clerk's Journal

Title of the American Pharmacist published in California from 1910 to 1920, now published under latter title. (See American Pharmacist)

#### Drug Clerk's Journal

A monthly journal published in Chicago from 1900 until sometime in 1902. It was a journal devoted to the drug trade in general and to the clerks and retailers in particular.

William F. Egler served as editor until June, 1901, when Wallace E. Kotz took charge. R. T. Van Pelt served as associate editor from September, 1900 until June, 1901.

S. T. Hart became associate editor in June, 1901 and in

September, 1901, he assumed the editors duties. (See 1, 2)

#### Drug Jobbers' Salesman

This journal first appeared in February, 1923, After the third volume the title was changed to Wholesale Druggist, under which title it continues at present.

#### Drug Market

This journal was published in Baltimore from 1890 to 1891. Two volumes were copyrighted. These may be seen at the library of the New York Academy of Medicine. (See 1, 2 )

#### Drug Markets

This was the title under which the Drug and Cosmetic Industry was published from 1926 to 1932. (See Drug and Cosmetic Industry)

#### The Drug Mill

This publication, a monthky journal devoted to the best interests of the pharmaceutical profession, was published by John H. Nelson, Cleveland, Ohio, in 1881. (See 3 )

#### Drug News

This journal was published in New York from 1880 to 1882. It seems that only three volumes were published. (See 1)

#### Drug News

This monthky journal was established in 1907 and was

published by the Drug Publishing Company of 1001 South Preston Street, Louisville, Kentucky. It purported to be a journal of household and retail drugs. It was discontinued sometime between 1914 and 1916. (See 2)

#### Drug News

Volume one, number one of this journal was published March 1, 1902, by A. J. Thorner, M. D. at Burlington, Iowa. This journal was purported to be a "medium for the dissemination of progressive ideas." (See 2)

#### Drug News

This journal was published in Des Moines, Iowa. Number one was published in 1886. (See 1)

#### Drug News

This monthly publication is the house organ of Yahr and Lange Drug Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The journal seems to have been established about 1915. (See 2)

#### Drug Printer

This journal was published in Philadelphia from 1866 to 1873, six volumes being published. (See 1)

#### Drug Reporter

This was a monthly journal published in Danbury, Connecticut in 1895. Only six numbers were published. It was published

by the Danbury Medical Printing Company, James O. Jordan<sup>109</sup>  
being editor. (See 1,2)

#### The Drug Store

This was a monthly journal published from 1888 to 1892 by the Drug Store Publishing Company of Saint Paul, Minnesota. (See 2)

#### Drug Topics

This journal started in 1886. It is the house organ of McKesson and Robbins, New York and when first published was a bi-monthly, later changing to a bi-weekly. E. H. Gane was the first editor. (See 1,2,3)

#### Drug Trade News

This journal, a newspaper for manufacturers of drug store products and their advertising agencies, is published in New York by the Topics Publishing Company. The first number appeared in 1925. (See 1)

#### Drug Trade Weekly

This journal first appeared in 1918. In December, 1922, it merged with the Pharmaceutical Era. In December, 1928, the Breden Publishing Corporation bought the publication rights from the Pharmaceutical Era and continued the journal under its former title. The December 15, 1928 issue was continued as volume five number fifty. (See 1)

Drug Treatise

This publication was first issued in Cincinnati in 1904. Volumes one to thirty one were published up to 1913 when it was continued as unnumbered treatise and continues so up to the present. (See 2)

Drug World

This monthly journal was published by Lawrence and Son, New York and St. Louis, from 1861 to 1883, when it consolidated with the Medical Brief. (See 3)

Drugdom

This monthly journal began publication in 1920. It was published by the Merchandizing Publication Corporation at Chicago, Illinois with Paul J. Mandabach as editorial director. Later it combined with Standard Remedies.

Druggist

This publication was issued at Memphis, Tennessee from 1918 1928. Place of publication was changed in 1928 to Jackson, Tennessee. The journal was discontinued in November, 1931. (See 2)

Druggist

Three volumes of this journal were published in Cincinnati from 1859 to 1861. Henry E. Foote was the editor. It was "a monthly newspaper for the trade." (See 2, 3)

The Druggist

This journal, edited by W. A. Whittlesey and G. H. Tilden at New Lebanon, New York, was issued from 1872 to 1875. (See 1, 3)

The Druggist

This journal was a continuation of the St. Louis Drug Market Reporter. It was published under this title from 1888 to 1889 and then continued as Meyer Brother's Druggist. (See Meyer Brother's Druggist)

The Druggist

This journal continued the Druggist and Paint and Oil Review. In 1885 it combined with the Pharmacist and Chemist and the title changed to the Western Druggist. (See Western Druggist)

Druggist's Advertiser and Trade Journal

This journal was published monthly by the Druggist's Advertiser and Publishing Company at 141 Chambers Street, New York City from 1876 to 1879. (See 3)

Druggists' Advocate

This journal was published in Boston, the first volume appearing in 1870. (See 1)

Druggist and Paint and Oil Review

This monthly journal which began publication in 1879,

was the forerunner of the Druggist, which journal changed<sup>112</sup> its title to Western Druggist. (See Western Druggist)

### The Druggists' Bulletin

This monthly exponent of pharmaceutical progress and news was published by George S. Davis of Detroit, Michigan from 1887 to 1890 when the title changed to Bulletin of Pharmacy. (See Bulletin of Pharmacy)

### Druggists' Circular

This journal was originally published, from 1857 to 1866, as American Druggists' Circular and Chemical Gazette, a practical journal of chemistry as applied to pharmacy, arts and sciences, and general business organ for druggists, chemists and apothecaries.

It was issued by Bridgeman and Company, apothecaries, from 158 Grand Street, New York, Henry Bridgeman being proprietor and editor. Dr. Lucas Vandever Newton became proprietor in 1858 and continued in this capacity until his death in 1869 when the paper passed into the hands of his nephew, John Newton, who managed it until September, 1884, when William O. Allison became publisher. In 1907 "The Druggists' Circular" appears in place of the individual publisher, a stock company having been formed.

Beginning with volume ten, 1866, the prefix "American" is dropped from the title. In 1907, volume fifty one, the title is further shortened to Druggists' Circular and con-

tinues under this title at present. (For a detailed historical account of the first fifty volumes see volume fifty-one)

#### Druggists' Circular and Chemical Gazette

This was the title of the Druggists' Circular from 1867 to 1906. (See Druggists' Circular)

#### Druggists' Gazette

This monthly journal was published in Chicago from September, 1889, until sometime in 1890. C. M. White was the first editor. (Seel,3)

#### The Druggists' Journal

This monthly journal was published in Philadelphia from August, 1882, until 1889. From 1882 until 1886 it was edited by L. E. Sayre and from 1887 until its discontinuance, Wm. L. Turner served as editor. George A. Frey and Company were the Publishers. (Seel,2)

#### Druggists' Journal

This journal was published in Chicago from January, 1886, until the latter part of 1897. Volumes one to twelve were published.

F. K. Tracy was its editor and Donahue and Henneberry were its publishers. (Seel,2)

#### Druggists' Journal

The first number of this monthly journal appeared in

July, 1923. The journal was published by the Druggists' Journal Publishing Company at Milwaukee, Wisconsin. It has been discontinued.

#### Druggist's Mutual

This monthly publication began issue in April, 1924 at Algona, Iowa. It was edited by Al Falkenhainer and was the official organ of the Druggist's Mutual Insurance Company.

#### Druggist's Printer

This was a journal published at Bristol, Pennsylvania from 1868 to about 1872. (See 1)

#### Druggist's Recorder

This monthly journal was published in Baltimore from 1890 to 1893. Hervert L. Lewis was both publisher and editor. (See 2)

#### Druggists' Research Bureau. New York Bulletin

This journal began publication in 1928.

#### Druggists Retrospect

This monthly journal of pharmacy, materia medica and chemistry was begun in Chicago in May, 1891. It was published by the Bradbury Publishing Company. Robert Bradbury was its editor. It was the house organ of Frederick Bradbury and Company, manufacturing pharmacists of Chicago. It was discontinued in 1892. (See 2)

Druggist Sundryman

This journal was started in 1892 and has since been discontinued.

The Drugman

This monthly trade journal, devoted to the interests of the drug, paint and oil trade, was published by the Drugman Company, Chattanooga, Tennessee, the first issue appearing in 1884. Place of publication was later changed to Nashville. T. B. Rains and J. C. Warton were editors. (See 3)

Drugs and Sundries

This monthly house organ of the Stein-Gray Drug Company of Cincinnati, Ohio, was published from November, 1902, until sometime in 1908 when it was discontinued. (See 1,2)

Drugs, Oils and Paints

This monthly journal first appeared in 1885 as Philadelphia Drug, Oil and Paint Reporter. In 1892 the title was changed to Drugs, Oils and Paints. It is still being published under the latter title. It purports to be "a journal devoted to the drug, oil, paint, glass and chemical trade, an independent, progressive, trustworthy periodical for paint and varnish manufacturers, factory superintendents, plant chemists, jobbers and high grade dealers."

Eastern Drug Market

This journal is a continuation of the Boston Drug Market,

First published in 1896. The change of title took place in 1900. The journal was discontinued in 1930. (See 1)

Ephemeris of Materia Medica, Pharmacy, Therapeutics and Collateral Information

This publication was issued irregularly by Edward R., Edward H. and Charles F. Squibb of Brooklyn, New York, from 1882 until 1904. It was suspended from November, 1885, until, January, 1887. (See 1)

The Formulary

This quarterly journal of practical pharmacy for druggists and pharmacists, was a supplement to Fenner's Formulary, Published by B. Fenner in Westfield, New York, from 1879 to 1888. (See 3)

The Formulary

This monthly journal of practical pharmacy, devoted to everyday wants and uses of American druggists, was published and edited by B. Fenner, Westfield, New York, from 1882 to 1893, when it was discontinued. (See 3)

Fort Worth Drug Reporter

This periodical was published by H. W. Williams and Company at Fort Worth, Texas from 1887 to 1889. (See 3)

Gaceta Medico- farmaceutica de Nueva York

This journal was published in New York from February,

1892, until sometime in 1898. (See 1)

### Good Fixtures

This illustrated bi-monthly magazine for retailers, published by the W. B. McLean Manufacturing Company, Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, first appeared in 1904 and was discontinued in 1929. (See 2)

### Goodrich Druggist

This publication of the B. F. Goodrich Rubber Company, began issue in 1916 at Akron, Ohio. It evolved from a small sheet to a regular newspaper size.

### The Graduate

This journal was published under the direction of the Alumni Association of the Chicago College of Pharmacy from 1893 to 1895. It is combined with the reports of the Alumni Association of the Chicago College of Pharmacy. (See 2)

### Humphry's Paint and Oil Trade and Wholesale Druggist

This was a journal published in New York from 1872 to 1874. (See 2)

### Ideas

This journal was edited by Maurice P. Gould and published at New Haven, Connecticut. The first numbers appeared in 1897. It was a publication devoted exclusively to drug advertising.

The first number of this publication, published monthly by the students of the Illinois School of Pharmacy, appeared in January, 1926 and has continued up to date. Andrew C. Scherer was the first editor. (See 2)

Independent Journal

This weekly journal which began in 1883 under the title of Independent Oil and Drug Journal was published in New York, the title changing to Independent Journal in 1884. It was discontinued in 1887. (See 2)

Independent Oil and Drug Journal

The title of this weekly journal was changed in 1884 to Independent Journal. (See Independent Journal)

The Independent Record

This was a weekly journal published in New York from 1883 to 1885. (See 2)

The Indiana Pharmacist

This monthly journal was published from 1882 to 1894, being devoted to pharmacy, chemistry and allied arts. It was published and edited by Jos. R. Perry at Indianapolis. (See 3)

The Indiana Pharmacist

This monthly publication first appeared in 1918. From

1918 until 1927 it was published in Indianapolis. During this time it was privately owned, W. A. Oren being the editor. In 1927 it became the official publication of the Indiana Pharmaceutical Association and the place of publication was changed to New Albany, F. V. McCullough became editor with the change of ownership. (See 2)

#### The Indicator

This monthly journal was the house organ of the Minneapolis Drug Company. It began publication in January, 1912 with Justin S. Brewer as editor. The journal barely survived one year.

#### Interstate Druggist

This journal appeared in 1899 at Columbus, Ohio under the title of Midland Druggist, published by the Midland Druggist Publishing Company with W. R. Ogier as editor.

In February, 1909, it absorbed the Pharmaceutical Review and was published until January, 1926, as Midland Druggist and Pharmaceutical Review. It continued its volume numbering.

Beginning with volume sixty-one, 1927, it was published as Interstate Druggist. (See 1, 3)

#### The International Druggist

This journal first appeared in December, 1910, published at San Antonio, Texas. It was discontinued in December, 1921.

(See 1)

The Journal

This Journal was issued by the Cincinnati College of Pharmacy and appeared as a quarterly in 1894. It was changed to a monthly in 1898. (See 2)

Journal and Transactions of the Maryland College of Pharmacy

The first number of this journal appeared in June, 1858 and the last number in April, 1862. Only two volumes were published. Three numbers of volume one appeared in 1858. In March, 1859 a new series was started. The journal was published in Baltimore.

The first series was published under the supervision of a committee. William J. Thomson was editor of the new series. (See 2, 3)

Journal of Central States College of Pharmacy

This was the forerunner of the Central States Journal of Pharmacy. (See Central States Journal of Pharmacy)

Journal of the American Pharmaceutical Association

This monthly journal of the American Pharmaceutical Association was first issued in January, 1912, at Columbus, Ohio. Volumes one to number five of volume three were edited by J. H. Beal. Due to ill health, Dr. Beal resigned in 1914, which resignation became effective September, 1914.

Ernest C. Marshall became acting editor in June, 1914, in which capacity he served until June, 1915, when the present editor, E. C. Eberle, was elected to the position, (See volume three, number six, page 769 and volume four, number

five, page 605)

Journal of the Association of the Alumni of the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy

This journal was first published by the Alumni Association of the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy as a quarterly from November, 1903 until June, 1905.

There followed a gap of about four years, after which publication was resumed under the same title, but the new volume was numbered one instead of three. The first number of this new volume was issued in September, 1909. The last number appeared in August, 1910, after which publication ceased and was not taken up again by the Alumni Association. (See 2)

Journal of the College of Pharmacy of Jersey City

This was a publication of the College of Pharmacy of the University of the State of New Jersey, first appearing in 1912.

Journal of the Kentucky Pharmaceutical Association

This monthly journal is the official organ of the Kentucky Pharmaceutical Association. It began issue in 1926.

Journal of the Michigan State Pharmaceutical Association and Detroit Retail Druggists' Association

This monthly journal published by the Detroit Retail Druggists' Association, was first started in 1912. It is the

official organ of the Michigan State Pharmaceutical Association and the Detroit Retail Druggists' Association.

Journal of Pharmacology

This was a continuation of the New York Journal of Pharmacy and was continued in 1904 as Alumni Journal.  
(See New York Journal of Pharmacy)

Journal of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy

This was the title under which the American Journal of Pharmacy was founded and published from 1825 to 1834. (See American Journal of Pharmacy)

Journal of the Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Association

This was the first title of the Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Journal. (See Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Journal)

The Kansas Pharmaceutical Association News Letter

This publication was started in May, 1927, replacing the Sunflower Druggists' Bulletin. It was first published twice a month as a mimeographed weekly letter. With volume three, number nine, August 15, 1929, the letter has been printed. Since November, 1931, it has been changed to a monthly. Topeka is the place of publication. (See 2)

The Kentucky Druggist

This monthly journal was first published in May, 1912. It was published by the Louisville Retail Druggist's Associa-

tion, 634 Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky. Robert J. Frick was the editor.

It was first published under the title of Druggist Bulletin. In January, 1914, the title was changed to Kentucky Druggist. The journal was discontinued between 1929 and 1930. (See 2)

#### The Laboratory

This was a monthly journal of the progress of chemistry, pharmacy, medicine, recreative science and the useful arts. It began publication about 1873 or 1874 and was published by William W. Bartlet, Boston. Charles F. Babcock, Boston was editor.

In 1877 the title changed to American Laboratory. (See American Laboratory)

#### The Last Word

This house organ of the Churchill Drug Company, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, was published from 1908 to 1914. (See 2)

#### Leavenworth Medical Herald and Journal of Pharmacy

This journal was published in Leavenworth, Kansas from 1867 to 1875. Nine volumes were published. From 1867 until 1870 it was published as Medical Herald. Volumes four and five, from 1870 to 1872, appeared as Leavenworth Medical Herald and Journal of Pharmacy. From that date until its discontinuance in 1875 it again appeared as the Medical Herald. (See 1)

Leo's Non Secret News

This was the house organ of D. G. Leo and Company, published at Des Moines, Iowa from 1909 to 1920. (See 2)

Lyons Latest Drug News

This journal is the house organ of I. C. Lyons and Company of New Orleans, Louisiana. (See 2)

Market Report

As the title indicates, this is a four page market report published by the Michigan Drug Company. It began publication about 1917.

Martin's Chemists' and Druggists' Bulletin and Medical Advocate

This was the precursor of the Pharmaceutical Record. (See Pharmaceutical Record)

The Mask

This is the official organ of the Kappa Psi Fraternity, a national pharmaceutical fraternity. It was established in 1904 and is published quarterly. Since 1917 it includes Delta Omicron Alpha Quarterly and the Black and Gold of Phi Delta.

For a time it was published under the title of Kappa Psi Mask. At present it is published at Menasha, Wisconsin.

Mc Pike's Bi-Monthly

This journal, devoted to the interests of the drug trade,

was first issued in Kansas City, Missouri by the McPike Drug Company, December, 1905.

A. H. Higbee was the first editor, continuing until August, 1906, when he was succeeded by A. C. Griffin who assumed the editor's duties in October of that year. J. A. Connelly followed him in 1907. The journal was discontinued in May, 1925. (See 2)

#### Medicinal Herbs

This monthly journal, devoted to the interests of ginseng, golden seal and medicinal plant growers, first appeared in New York in 1922. James Scott was the editor. (See 2)

#### Medico-Pharmaceutical Critic and Guide

This journal was published as Medico-Pharmaceutical Critic and Guide from 1898 until 1915 when the title changed to Critic and Guide. (See 1) ~~Memphis Drug List~~

#### Memphis Druggist

This journal was published from 1915 to 1929 at Memphis, Tennessee.

#### Memphis Retail Druggist

This weekly publication of the Memphis Drug Club first appeared in July, 1928, published at Memphis, Tennessee. Only three volumes were published, the journal being discontinued in June, 1931. (See 2)

Merck's Market Report

Title of Merck's Report from 1892 to 1893. (See Merck's Report)

Merck's Market Report and Pharmaceutical Journal

Title of Merck's Report from 1893 to 1895. (See Merck's Report)

Merck's Monthly Report

This was title of Merck's Report when first established. (See Merck's Report)

Merck's Report

This journal was first published in New York in January, 1892, under the title of Merck's Monthly Report. (Vol. 1, Number 1, page.1). In April of that year the title was changed to Merck's Market Report. (Vol. 1, Number 4, page 1). In March, 1893, the journal appeared as Merck's Market Report and Pharmaceutical Journal. In January, 1896, the present title was adopted.

It began as a monthly publication, changing to a semi-monthly in January, 1895, returning to a monthly in 1899. In January, 1916, the form of the journal was changed and it appeared as a quarterly from that time on.

Merrell Messenger

This publication of ideas and suggestions for the drug store proprietor and his clerks, first appeared in 1915. It

was the house organ of the Wm. S. Maxwell Chemical Company of Cincinnati, Ohio. In 1928 the publication was indefinitely suspended. (See 2)

### The Messenger

This was the title under which the New York Journal of Pharmacy appeared from 1924 to 1931. (See New York Journal of Pharmacy)

### Meyer Brothers' Druggist

This was a continuation of the Druggist, 1889 to 1920, after which date the journal was published as Meyer Druggist. (See Meyer Druggist)

### Meyer Druggist

This journal was the first drug periodical west of the Mississippi River. It was established under the title of St. Louis Drug Market Reporter by C. F. G. Meyer at St. Louis, Missouri in April, 1880.

In January, 1888, the title was changed to the Druggist with H. M. Whelpley as editor and C. F. G. Meyer as associate editor. In June, 1888, another change of title was made, this time to Meyer Brothers' Druggist under which title it was published until 1920 when the word "Brothers" was dropped. The journal continues at present as Meyer Druggist.

This publication is the house organ of Meyer Brothers' Drug Company, and when first established was mailed free to its customers until January, 1895, when C.F.G. Meyer became

publisher and the journal was placed on a subscription basis. (See Meyer Brothers' Druggist, Vol. 26, number eleven, page 350)

#### The Miami Valley Druggist

This is the publication of the Dayton Druggists Association, published at Dayton, Ohio. (See 2)

#### Michigan Drug News

This was the forerunner of the American Pharmacist published in Detroit, Michigan from 1885 to 1890. (See American Pharmacist)

#### Michigan Druggist

This magazine for the retailer was first issued in 1908. It is a monthly journal published by the Michigan Drug Company of Detroit.

The first few years of its publication it gained but little prominence and was little more than a price list. Since January, 1913, a new series was started and the journal gained much in circulation. (See 2)

#### Midland Druggist

This was the title of the Interstate Druggist from 1899 to 1909. (See Interstate Druggist)

#### Midland Druggist and Pharmaceutical Review

This was a continuation of the Midland Druggist, a

Journal later continued as Interstate Druggist. (See Interstate Druggist) 129

#### Midwestern Druggist

This monthly journal, issued by the Midwestern Druggist Publishing Company at Kansas City, Missouri, is printed wholly in the interest of the retail drug trade, especially of the midwestern states. J. W. Kelley is publisher and owner. The first number of this journal was published in November, 1925. (See 2)

#### Milwaukee Journal of Pharmacy

This monthly journal of chemistry, pharmacy and materia medica was issued in Milwaukee, Wisconsin from 1899 to 1900. Professor R. E. W. Sommer was editor and Otto Klinkenberg was associate editor.

#### Minnesota Druggist

This was the association paper of the Minneapolis Association of Retail Druggists. It was published from 1916 to 1918. (See 2)

#### The Missouri Druggist

This publication was first started as a four page bulletin, consisting of association news and trade notes, has grown to a fifty page journal. It is the official organ of the Missouri Pharmaceutical Association.

The first number was published in September, 1917, with

E. A. Sennewald as editor. He edited the first five numbers of volume one. W. H. Lamont is the present editor and manager.

### The Modern Druggist

This monthly journal was established in 1912. It was first published by the Modern Druggist Publishing Company at New Orleans. At present it is being published by the Southern Druggist Publishing Company at New Orleans.

This journal is the mouthpiece and open forum of the southern drug world.

### Modern Pharmacy

This journal began issue as a bi-monthly in September, 1904 at Detroit, published by Parke, Davis and Company with C. T. Marshall as editor from its beginning until June, 1907.

Pharmaceutical Notes published by Parke, Davis and Company from 1894 to 1904 was the forerunner of this journal. (See 2)

### Monatsblatt

This was a German publication first issued in December, 1895 as a journal "four Apotheker, Droguisten und Aerzten zur Foerderung der Gesamtinteressen des pharmaceutischen Standes in den Vereinigten Staaten von Nord-America."

A. Wortmann and R. A. Matter jointly edited the first seven numbers of volume one, after which R. A. Matter became sole editor. It seems to have been discontinued in 1897.

(See 2)

This was a monthly journal first issued in New York in May, 1894. It was published by a committee of the Verein, composed of E. G. Goetting, F. T. Schmidt, and Dr. W. Mettenheimer. (See Vol. 2, Number 7, page 110)

This journal was discontinued about 1895. (See 2)

Monitor Medico Farmaceutico

This journal, published in New York, was started in 1883 and discontinued in the same year. (See 1)

Monthly Retrospect of Medicine and Pharmacy

This monthly journal was first issued in Philadelphia in 1895 and seems to have been discontinued in 1902. It was the house organ of Wm. R. Warner and Company. E. H. Gingrich was the editor and the Retrospect Company were publishers.

(See 1, 2)

Monthly Review of Medicine and Pharmacy

Title of Quinologist from 1879 to 1882. (See Quinologist)

Monthly Therapeutic Topics

This publication, devoted to the cause of rational medicine, was issued under the auspice of the department of publicity of propaganda of the National Association of Retail Druggists. It was published in Chicago, first appearing in 1912.

Mortar and Pestle

This journal was published at Elmira, N.Y. from 1895 to 1896 with Clay W. Holmes as editor. (See 3)

Moulton's Live Wire

This pharmaceutical journal was published in Seattle, Washington by Will H. Moulton. (See 2)

The Mulford Digest

This house organ of the H. K. Mulford Company of Phil. was first issued in June, 1912. Volumes one and two consist of four numbers each which were issued in quarterly periods, volume one from June, 1912 to April, 1913 and volume two from July, 1913 to December, 1914. Since May, 1915, only one Digest has been issued each year.

National Association Retail Druggists Journal

This weekly journal was first issued in October, 1902, under the title of National Association Retail Druggists Notes. Volumes one to sixteen, number four, were published under this title. In May, 1913, the title was changed to N. A. R. D. Journal.

Charles M. Carr was editor from its inception until January, 1914, when he was succeeded by Hugh Craig. In 1909 Otto E. Bruder became assistant editor.

Beginning with volume fifty-four, January, 1932, the journal changed from a weekly to a semi-monthly. This journal is the official organ of the National Association of Retail Druggists.

National Association Retail Druggists Notes

This weekly journal is the forerunner of the N. A. R. D. Journal. (See N. A. R. D. Journal)

The National Drug Clerk

This monthly journal, devoted to the interest of the drug clerk, began issue in January, 1913, at Chicago, Illinois. It is the official organ of the National Association of Drug Clerks.

Volumes nine to ten, number six, January, 1921 to June, 1922, were published as Drug Store Merchandizing. (See 1)

Edwin G. Hopkins was the first editor, and P. A. Mandabach who served as assistant editor from the beginning succeeded Mr. Hopkins "in the editors chair" in July, 1913. In October, 1913, Charles H. Bowersox was made associate editor, and in January, 1915, Paul J. Mandabach was appointed acting editor. In May, 1915, he became sole editor, whereas P. A. Mandanbach retired in June, 1915. In July of that year, L. W. Coleman succeeded Mr. Bowersox as associate editor.

Its editorial policy is reflected in the following interests; Moral, Mental and Commercial qualifications of the drug clerk, pharmaceutical legislation, reciprocal registration, Anti-substitution, higer educational standards, price maintainance and every important issue designed to elevate the professional and commercial side of pharmacy. (See 1,2)

National Druggist

The first weekly drug periodical established west of the

Mississippi River was published September 2, 1882, under the title of St. Louis Druggist. It was published by the Druggist Publishing Company, the stock of which was held by employes of the Richardson Drug Company. Dr. J. A. Peters was editor until his death, February 22, 1883, when A. C. Stocking became editor. March 1, 1884, Henry M. Whelpley became pharmaceutical editor.

July 4, 1884, the title was changed to the National Druggist. A. C. Stocking resigned as editor in November, 1885, and Henry M. Whelpley became editor with Dr. Otto A. Wall as associate editor.

August 1, 1887, the journal was changed from a weekly to a semi-monthly, and in November, 1893, it changed from a semi-monthly to a monthly publication and has remained so up to the present.

At the close of 1887 Whelpley and Wall resigned and Dr. Frank L. James, who had been departmental writer, became editor. In 1889 the Richardson Drug Company retired from business and the publication changed hands. In November, 1893, it was again sold. Henry R. Strong, one of the new stockholders, became proprietor and editor in April, 1897 and has continued so up to the present. (See Meyer Bros. Druggist, Vol. 26, Number 11, page 250)

#### The National Druggist's Journal

This journal, devoted to the trade, was established in 1882 at Cincinnati, Ohio. It was discontinued the following year. George Matteson was the editor. (See 3)

This journal was first published in New York in April, 1912. It seems to have been discontinued in 1913, (See 1)

New England Druggist

This monthly journal was first issued in Boston in 1888. In 1903 the title was changed to the Apothecary and New England Druggist. In June, 1904, the latter part of the title was dropped and the journal assumed its present title of Apothecary. (See Apothecary )

New Idea

This publication appeared irregularly from its beginning in 1879 until 1889 when it was discontinued. In 1900 it reappeared as a quarterly, and in 1906 it became a monthly.

James W. T. Knox was appointed editor in 1900 and W. H. Sanderson associate editor in May, 1910.

This journal was the house organ of Frederick Stearns and Company of Detroit. It was discontinued about 1924. (See 2)

New Jersey Drug News

Volume one, number one , of this journal appeared on November 1, 1931. (See 2)

New Jersey Journal of Pharmacy

This monthly journal, published by the New Jersey Pharmaceutical Association, at Atlantic City, New Jersey, began publication in 1928.

The New Jersey Pharmaceutical Association has published an annual volume of Proceedings ever since 1870. In 1927, the Proceeding number was called the New Jersey Journal of Pharmacy, volume one, number one, and in October of that year a monthly journal under the same title made its appearance and has continued as a monthly publication since then. Each year the Proceedings of the Association constitute one number of the journal. (Seel, 2)

#### New Jersey Pharmaceutical Record

This publication was issued in Newark, New Jersey, in 1875. (See 1)

#### New Remedies

This was the title under which the American Druggist was first published. (See American Druggist)

#### New York County Medico-Pharmaceutical League Journal

This journal was published from 1899 until 1901 in New York. (See 1)

#### New York Journal of Pharmacy

This journal was published monthly by the New York College of Pharmacy from 1852 to 1854, only three volumes being published.

The first issue published in January, 1852, sets forth the following purpose for the publication. "As a means of benefiting the profession of pharmacy, of keeping its mem-

bers acquainted with the progress it is making at home and abroad, and of inspiring among them a spirit of scientific inquiry, it is believed that the establishment of the New York Journal of Pharmacy, devoted to the pursuits and interests of apothecaries, would be of the highest utility. (See New York Journal of Pharmacy, Vol. 9, No. 1, page 9)

Failing of support, the journal was discontinued in 1854, to be revived as the Annual Report of the Alumni Association of the College of Pharmacy of the City of New York in 1872. This publication continued until 1893, when it was converted into the Alumni Journal. (See 2)

The Alumni Journal made its first appearance in February, 1894, under the editorial management of Dr. O. G. Harrison who served for only one issue. Dr. Henry Kraemer succeeded him, serving until May, 1895. From June to December, 1895, the chair was filled by B. Frank Hays, from January to April, 1896, by Fred Hohenthal, from May to November, 1896, by Alfred H. Mason, with Adolph Henning taking charge in December, 1896.

In January, 1897, the publication became known as the Journal of Pharmacology and was published under that title until 1904 when it changed back to the original title with the January, 1905, number. Dr. Smith Ely Jelliffe acted as editor until January, 1899. Chas. W. Bjorkwall succeeded him, serving until January, 1900. From then until April, 1901, Harry B. Ferguson acted as manager and was then relieved by Dr. Jelliffe who again took up the management until April, 1903, when Chas. A. Lotz became editor.

From January, 1905, to 1914 it again bore the title of Alumni Journal, edited by C. A. Lotz. In 1912, Dr. Curt P. Wimmer became editor in chief with Mr. Lotz as business manager. In 1914, Dr. Wimmer assumed editorship alone.

In 1914, the title again changed to New York Journal of Pharmacy, the original title. A new series of volume numbers was instituted.

In 1916, Jeannot Hostmann was appointed editor and the title was changed to Columbia University College of Pharmacy Alumni Journal. Under this title it was published until the spring of 1917 when it was discontinued, and until 1924 there was no alumni or college publication.

The publication was revived in October, 1924, by Curt P. Wimmer as the Messenger. With the April number, 1931, volume 8, number 4, the title once more changed to the New York Journal of Pharmacy and continues under that title at present.

#### New York Pharmacist

This journal first appeared in January, 1927. It is published by the New York Pharmaceutical Conference, inc.

(See 1)

#### New York Register of Medicine and Pharmacy

This journal began issue in October, 1850, and continued until September 15, 1881. It was a publication to meet the demands of physician and pharmacist, edited by C. D. Griswold.

(See 1,2)

Volume one, 1895 to 1896, to number nine of volume two, 1896 to 1897, of this journal was published as Buffalo Druggist. In 1897, the title changed to Northern Druggist. (See 2, 3)

Northern Ohio Druggists' Association

This drug publication is issued at Cleveland, Ohio. (See 2 )

Northwestern Drug News

This house organ of the Northwestern Drug Company, published for its members, began issue in 1929 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. J. H. Marshall has been editor throughout its publication.

The Northwestern Druggist

This monthly journal, devoted to the interests of the druggists of the northwest, is owned and published by the Bruce Publishing Company of St. Paul, Minnesota.

The journal was first issued in December, 1899, at Minneapolis. In May, 1902, it was consolidated with the Wisconsin Druggist's Exchange.

H. C. Chapin was president and manager until August, 1912 when J. R. Bruce and Fred T. Hall became the owners. B. A. Pratt was appointed editor and G. A. Welch assistant editor in November, 1901. In June, 1902, Chapin replaced Pratt in the editor's chair. In August, 1912, the journal was sold to J. R. Bruce and Fred T. Hall.

After the sale, Fred T. Hall became editor, and Justin S. Brewer, and F. A. Usher Smith were assistant editors. Smith succeeded Hall in June, 1913. He was replaced by W. C. Moulton in February, 1914. Justin Brewer and Fred T. Hall were associate editors under Smith. Hall was associate editor under Moulton. In June, 1915, J. R. Bruce became editor, with C. A. Robinson as associate editor.

G. A. Bender is the present editor with W. J. Sudro and J. W. Slocum as contributing editors. (See 2)

#### The Northwestern Pharmacist

This journal, devoted to the interest and progress of pharmacy, was published in Minneapolis from 1886 to 1888. (See 3)

#### Notes on New Pharmaceutical Products

Eight volumes of this journal were published in St. Louis, Missouri from 1889 to 1896. (See 1)

#### Notes on New Remedies

This house organ of Lehn and Fink, Wholesale Druggists and Manufacturing Chemists, was established in 1888 as a monthly by Mr. Fink, the founder of the firm. It was discontinued in 1911 but publication was resumed in November, 1923, by the present vice president of the company, Mr. W.H. Gesell. The second series of the publication was a quarterly. It was discontinued in December, 1926, the last issue being volume four, number one. (See 2)

The Nyalist

This is the official organ of the Nyal Club.

The Official Register

This was a monthly bulletin published by the Iowa Pharmaceutical Association, first at Algona and later at Vinton, Iowa, from 1913 to 1927. (See 2)

The Ohio Druggist

This monthly journal is the official publication of the Ohio State Pharmaceutical Association. It began publication in 1925 and is published in Columbus, Ohio.

The Ohio Valley Druggists' Association Review

Volume one of this publication appeared in 1911. It is published at Cincinnati, Ohio, by the Ohio Valley Druggists' Association. (See 2)

Oil and Drug News

This weekly journal was first published on November 23, 1880 as Oil and Drug News. It continued under this title until June, 20, 1882, when the title was changed to Weekly Drug News and Prices Current.

It was published by Root and Tinker of New York and edited by George Bartholomew. (See Weekly Drug News) (See 3)

Oil Paint and Drug Reporter

This publication made its first appearance on Wednesday,

October 18, 1871, with Mr. Wm. O. Allison's name at the head of its editorial page as proprietor. After fifty years his name still remained there and he continued in touch with the Journal.

This journal, published every Monday by Oil, Paint and Drug Reporter, Inc., at 12 Gold Street, New York, at present comprises the following journals; Drug, Paint and Oil Trade; New York Drug Bulletin; Weekly Drug News; New York Druggists' Price Current; Soap Makers' Journal; Oil and Paint Review; and International Petroleum Reporter.

#### Oil, Paint and Drug Review

This monthly journal, edited by Hugo G. Adams, New York, was published from 1880 until 1883, when it consolidated with the Oil, Paint and Drug Reporter, a journal established in 1871. (See Oil, Paint and Drug Reporter) (See 3)

#### Oil, Paint and Drug Review

This journal was established by D. Van Ness Person at Chicago in 1885 and has since been discontinued. (See 3)

#### Oklahoma Druggist's Bulletin

This publication was issued by the Oklahoma Pharmaceutical Association, first appearing in 1917. It is still being published. (See 2)

#### Oklahoma Druggist's Review

This was a monthly trade paper published by C. D. Smith

Drug Company, Oklahoma City, from 1894 to 1895. (See 3)

#### Oklahoma Druggist

This was the house organ of the Alexander Drug Company, published from 1894 to 1924. It was bought by the Travel-Taylor Company in 1925 and published <sup>as The Drug Merchant until</sup> ~~through 1930~~. (See 2) *Nov. 1930.*

#### Omaha Drug and Oil Gazette

This journal, published in Omaha, Nebraska, from 1886 to 1886, was edited by Charles J. Daubach. Only two volumes were issued. (See 1, 3)

#### Omaha Druggist

This monthly journal of pharmacy which began issue at Omaha, Nebraska in 1887, was first published by C. H. Weller and Amos Field with M. W. Nyerson as editor.

It later passed into the hands of the Richardson Drug Company of Omaha and in 1927 was discontinued by the Churchill Drug Company, successors of the Richardson Drug Company.

Thirty-nine volumes were published. (See 3, 2)

#### The Optimist

The first issue of this publication appeared in October, 1926, and has been published bi-monthly since that date. It is published at Watertown, South Dakota, edited by W. F. Michel.

The Optimist is published in the interest of the independent retail druggists and devotes all its energies toward

fighting out prices and chain stores and encouraging the professional in place of the "ultra modern" methods of merchandizing. (See 2)

### The Organizer

This is a monthly journal published by the Chicago Retail Druggists' Association. It displaced the C. R. D. A. Auxiliary, the first number appearing in April, 1902. (See 2)

### Pacific Drug Review

This monthly journal, devoted to the interests of and reaching exclusively and in its entirety, the drug trade of the entire Pacific slope, was founded in 1888. It is published in Portland, Oregon and is the official journal of Oregon, Washington, Utah, Idaho, Montana and Arizona State Pharmaceutical Associations, Portland Retail Druggists' Association and recognized official organ of the entire west trade.

When first issued, it was published by Snell, Heitschu and Woodward and edited by H. D. Dietrich. (See 3)

### Pacific Druggist

This monthly journal was the authorized organ of the California Pharmaceutical Society and College of Pharmacy, edited by W. M. Searby at San Francisco. In April, 1894, Frank T. Green became editor.

In 1895 the title was changed to Pacific Druggist and Physician. (See 1)

### Pacific Pharmacist

This monthly Journal began issue in May, 1907 at San Francisco, California. It was published by the Galen Publishing Company until the death of its editor in 1909, when the Searby Memorial Fund became the publishers. The Galen Publishing Company again took charge of the publication in 1911.

W. M. Searby served as editor from May, 1907 until his death in 1909. Albert Schneider succeeded Searby and served until March, 1915. C. L. Eddy served as editor from February, 1916 until June, 1916. The Journal was discontinued in 1919.

This Journal was the publication of the California Pharmaceutical Association and includes the Association Journal and Proceedings. (See 1, 2)

#### Pacific Record of Medicine and Pharmacy

This Journal was published in San Francisco from 1886 to 1899. Volume one, numbers one to seven, were published as Pacific Record of Medicine and Pharmacy, after which the title was changed to Pacific Record of Medicine and Surgery. Under this title it was published until 1899 when it merged into Occidental Medical Times.

Volumes one to two, number two, were published in both English and Spanish. (See 1)

#### The Package Medicine Journal

This Journal was published monthly by the Package Medicine Journal Publishing Company at Chicago. It began publication December, 1923, and was the official organ of the United Medicine Manufacturers of America. A. L. Liljestrom was editor from its inception until May, 1924. (See 2)

Package Remedies

This journal, published monthly by the Package Medicine Journal Publishing Company, first appeared in February, 1925. It was the official organ of the Package Medicine Association, published at Chicago. (See 20)

Paint, Oil and Chemical Review

This journal began publication in 1883 and is published at Chicago. (See 1)

Papyrus Ebers

This magazine, published in the interest of pharmacy by the North Dakota Pharmacy Club first appeared in 1928. It bears the title of the oldest drug manuscript which dates from 1500 B. C.

Patchwork

This monthly journal was the house organ of the E. L. Patch Company of Boston, Massachusetts. Number one was published in May, 1918. The journal was edited by Thomas Dreier. (See 2)

The Pennsylvania Pharmacist

This publication is the official journal of the Pennsylvania Pharmaceutical Association. It began issue in 1918.

Peoria Drug Review

This journal, devoted to the interests of the drug, oil

and paint trade, began issue in 1887 and was published for only one year. It was published monthly by Colburn Birks and Company of Peoria, Illinois. (See 3)

#### The Fercolator

This journal, which was first published occasionally by the Chemists' Club at 52 East 41 st. Street, New York, first appeared in 1909. It later became a monthly publication.

(See 2)

#### Pharmaceutical Advance

This journal, devoted to progressive pharmacy and practical therapeutics, is published "pro re nata" for the purpose of acquainting the medical profession with improvements effected in the preparation and presentation of standard drugs. It first appeared in 1914.

#### The Pharmaceutical Digest

This journal was published at Portland, Oregon, first appearing in 1895. It seems to have been discontinued in 1898. (See 1)

#### Pharmaceutical Gazette

This journal first appeared in 1874 under the title of Tennessee Pharmaceutical Gazette, published at Nashville, Tenn. Two volumes were published under this title when it became known as Pharmaceutical Gazette, three volumes being published under this title. The journal was discontinued in 1875. (See 1)

Pharmaceutical News

This monthly publication is the house organ of the Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. It began publication in September, 1915.

Pharmaceutical Notes

This quarterly journal was published by Parke, Davis and Company from January, 1894, until June, 1904, at Detroit. It comprised twenty pages of trade news and laboratory notes from Parke, Davis and Company. (See 2)

Pharmaceutical Archives

This monthly publication was first issued in January, 1898, at Milwaukee, Wisconsin as an outgrowth of the Pharmaceutical Review. Dr. Edward Kremers was editor and the Pharmaceutical Review Publishing Company, publishers. It was discontinued in 1903. (See 2) *Revived? Vol. 9 (1938)*  
*10 (1939)*

The Pharmaceutical Bulletin

Volume one, number one, of this publication appeared in November, 1885, published in Philadelphia by Wm. R. Warner and Company, manufacturing chemists. (See 2)

Pharmaceutical Epitome

This was a publication which appeared in Washington in 1875. (See 1)

Pharmaceutical Era

The first number of this journal was published January 1, 1887. It was a monthly published at Detroit and consisted of thirty-two pages of reading matter besides some advertising. It was founded by D. O. Hayes with Albert B. Lyons as editor. In May, 1894, the place of publication was changed to New York.

In October, 1888, the Era Supplement was established. Fifteen numbers of the Supplement appeared, coming out on the 15 th. of each month, thereby, alternating with the Era. At the beginning of 1890 the supplementary publication was enlarged and rechristened the "Trade Edition". In 1891 the Trade Edition and Era merged into one semi-monthly. (See volume 16, page 851)

On Thursday, January 3, 1895, it became a weekly, changing to a monthly in January, 1910. The journal was discontinued in 1932.

#### Pharmaceutical Error

This was a burlesque on the Pharmaceutical Era published at Ann Arbor in 1919. Only one issue was published for distribution at a student banquet. (See 2)

#### Pharmaceutical News

This journal was published in Peoria, Illinois, from October, 1878, to July, 1879. Only numbers one to four of volume one were published. (See 1)

#### Pharmaceutical Record

This journal was first published by Chas. S. Martin as a

monthly in 1881, under the title of Martin's Chemists' and Druggists' Bulletin and Medical Advocate. In 1882, P. W. Bedford became editor. In 1883 when its editor, P. W. Bedford, came into possession of the journal it was published as a semi-monthly journal of pharmacy, chemistry, materia medica and allied sciences, and the title was changed to Pharmaceutical Record.

In 1883, Thomas J. Keenan became associate editor, becoming editor after Bedford's death.

In 1893, it consolidated with the American Druggist, being published as American Druggist and Pharmaceutical Record. (See American Druggist)

#### Pharmaceutical Review

This journal was first published in January, 1883, under the title of Pharmaceutische Rundschau, a German monthly publication, published in New York. Dr. Fr. Hoffmann was editor.

Beginning with number one of volume fourteen, January, 1896, the title was translated to Pharmaceutical Review and the journal published in the English language. The place of publication was changed to Milwaukee, Wisconsin and Dr. Edward Kremers of the University of Wisconsin became editor. The journal was consolidated with the Midland Druggist in February, 1909. (See 1 and vol. 13, page 249)

#### The Pharmaceutical Review

This monthly journal appeared in 1892 and was discontinued the following year, 1893. It was published at Baltimore under the auspices of the Maryland College of Pharmacy. Charles

Caspari Jr. was the editor. (See 3)

### Pharmaceutische Rundschau

This was the title under which the Pharmaceutical Review was published from 1883 until 1895. (See Pharmaceutical Review)

### The Pharmacist

This monthly journal, devoted to pharmacy, chemistry and the collateral sciences, was published by the Chicago College of Pharmacy from 1868 to 1885.

In 1869 the title was changed to the Pharmacist and Chemical Record. With number five of volume six the title again reverted to the Pharmacist. It continued under this title until 1879 when it was again changed to the Pharmacist and Chemist, under which title it was published until it consolidated with the Western Druggist in 1886.

The first volume was edited by E. H. Sargent and Albert E. Ebert; the second volume by Albert E. Ebert; and the third, fourth and fifth volumes by N. Gray Bartlett and A. E. Ebert. Mr. Bartlett severed his connections with the journal in April, 1873. (See vol. 6, page 126). Mr. Ebert again took charge until the close of volume nine, when the Chicago College of Pharmacy conducted the journal with the aid of various publication committees. Oscar Oldberg edited the last volume.

During the first year of its publication, the journal was a quarterly, but from 1869 it was published monthly.

(See Western Druggist)

The Pharmacist and Chemical Record

Continuation of the Pharmacist from 1868 to 1872. (See the Pharmacist)

The Pharmacist and Chemist

Continuation of the Pharmacist from 1879 to 1884. (See the Pharmacist)

The Pharmacologist

This quarterly journal, established in 1897, continued for only four issues. It was published by Fredrick K. Stearns at Detroit, Michigan,

Numbers one and two were edited by F. E. Stewart, M. D. J. O. Schlotterbeck edited numbers three and four. James W. T. Knox and Charles C. Yarbrough assisted him as associate editors. (See 2)

Pharmacraft

This was a trade journal issued by Kirk Geary and Company at Sacramento, California for four or five years. It was published between 1910 and 1915.

Pharmascope

This is the official undergraduate publication of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science. It began publication in 1928 and is issued seven time a year.

Pharabote

This publication was issued for but a short time. It was a publication of the College of Pharmacy of the University of New Jersey, edited by Herman H. North. (See 2)

Philadelphia Association of Retail Druggists' Bulletin

This publication, issued monthly in the interest of the Philadelphia Association of Retail Druggists, was first published in 1901.

Philadelphia College of Pharmacy Alumni Report

This was the title of the Bulletin of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science from 1891 to 1893. (See Bull. of the Phil. Coll. of Pharmacy and Science)

Philadelphia Drug, Oil and Paint Reporter

This was the forerunner of Drugs, Oils and Paints. (See Drugs, Oils and Paints)

Philadelphia Druggist and Chemist

This was the title of the Quinologist from 1878 to 1879. (See the Quinologist)

Physician and Pharmaceutist

Volumes one to three of this journal were published from 1868 to 1871 in New York.

Beginning with volume four, the title changed to Physician and Pharmacist which title later changed to Physician and Pharmacist and the Bulletin of the Medico-

legal Society. (See Physician and Pharmacist and the Bulletin of the Medico-legal Society), (See 1)

#### Physician and Pharmacist

This was a continuation of Physician and Pharmacist, later continued as Physician and Pharmacist and the Bulletin of the Medico-legal Society. (See Physician and Pharmacist and the Bull. of the Medico-legal Society)

#### Physician and Pharmacist and the Bulletin of the Medico-legal Society

This journal was published under the title of Physician and Pharmacist from 1868 to 1871, volumes one to three. With volume four, 1871, the title changed to Physician and Pharmacist, under which title it continued until 1879, number seven, volume twelve. Numbers eight to twelve of volume twelve, 1879, were published as Physician and Pharmacist and the Bulletin of the Medico-legal Society after which the word "Pharmacist" was dropped and the journal continued as Physician and Bulletin of the Medico-legal Society. (See 1)

#### Physicians Drug News

This journal of pharmacy for physicians was published monthly by the Physicians Drug News Company at Newark, New Jersey. The journal was established in 1906, continuing for ten years, being discontinued in 1916.

Birdsey L. Maltbie Ph. G. was managing editor, A. P.

Reed, M. D., medical editor, W. E. Cummings, Ph. D., chemical editor.

The Office Practitioner, a medical magazine devoted to the development and improvement of office practice, was incorporated with the above journal. (See 2)

### The Pill

This monthly journal, devoted to the interests of the Wisconsin Drug Trade, the Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Association, the Wisconsin Travelers, Ladies' Auxiliary and Drug Clerks, was published from 1910 until 1920 at Wauwatosa, Wisconsin. Charles Edwin Wilson was editor.

### Pittsburg Druggist

This monthly publication is the house organ of the George A. Kelly Company of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania and began issue in 1887. (See 1,2)

### Popular Science News and Boston Journal of Chemistry

See Boston Journal of Chemistry.

### Practical Druggist and Pharmaceutical Review of Reviews

This monthly journal which first appeared in January, 1897, at New York, was published by Lillard and Company with Benjamin Lillard as editor until April, 1910. After that Romaine Pearson became publisher and Charles W. Farson, editor. (See vol. 28, number 4, page 361)

In October, 1912, Otto Raubenheimer succeeded Farson as

editor, serving until March, 1914. (See vol. 32, number 2, page 47). After Raubenheimer's resignation, Romaine Pearson became editor. (See 2)

### The Prescription

This monthly journal was published in Danbury, Connecticut from 1891 to 1897. It was published by the Danbury Medical Printing Company, and W. C. Wile was its editor.

This journal continued the Therapeutic Analyst which was published from 1889 to 1890. In 1897 it merged into the New England Medical Monthly and the Prescription. This publication continued until 1912 when it merged into American Practitioner. (See 1,2)

### Purity

This was a magazine and bulletin of health, food, and drugs, published at Lowell, Massachusetts from June, 1907 to August, 1909. The title varies. (See 1)

### The Purdue News

This is a bulletin of information concerning the School of Pharmacy and published each month, except September, by Purdue University at Lafayette, Indiana. It first appeared in 1920. (See 2)

### The Purdue Pharmacist

This college publication first appeared in the fall of 1924, since which time it has been published every six weeks (except during the months of July, August and September) by

the students of the school of Pharmacy of Purdue University, Lafayette, Indiana. Marvin D. Myers of the class of 1924 was its first editor.

"This publication represents an expression of the interest that the students of the Purdue University, School of Pharmacy, take in the profession they intend to follow through life." (See 2)

### Quinologist

This monthly publication first appeared in Philadelphia in 1878 as the Philadelphia Druggist and Chemist. C. C. Vanderbeck was the editor.

In 1879 the title changed to Monthly Review of Medicine and Pharmacy, under which title it appeared until 1882. In 1883 it appeared as Quinologist, to be discontinued in February, 1884. (See 1, 3)

### Record of New Remedies and Their Therapeutic Value

This publication appeared in Philadelphia from January, 1871 until about 1877. (See 1)

### Red Cross Messenger

This house organ of Johnson and Johnson, New Brunswick, New Jersey, was first published in September, 1908 and intended for the drug trade. F. B. Kilmer was the first editor. This journal later became a pictorial bulletin. (See 2)

### The Registered Pharmacist

This small publication which was first published in October, 1919, is the official publication of the Abbott Laboratories, Ravenswood, Chicago. (See 2)

#### Registered Pharmacist and Drug Clerk's Journal

This monthly journal is a continuation of the American Drug Clerk's Journal, published in Chicago. (See American Drug Clerk's Journal)

#### The Reserve Pharmacon

This publication, devoted to professional pharmacy, is published quarterly by the students of the School of Pharmacy of Western Reserve University at Cleveland, Ohio. The first number appeared in April, 1927.

#### Retail Druggist

This monthly journal, devoted to the business or commercial side of pharmacy, was started in Detroit in November, 1893, by Mr. Newlands Hayes and was published by the Universal Trade Association, an organization of druggists. (See 1, 2)

#### The Retort

This monthly journal, devoted to the interests of the departments of medicine, dentistry and pharmacy of the Milwaukee Medical College, its alumni, training school and professions, first appeared in 1900. It was published at Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Warren B. Hill was editor.

Revista Americana de Farmacia, Medicina of Hospitals

Twenty-seven volumes of this journal were published in New York. It first appeared in 1895 and was discontinued in 1921. (See 1)

Rexall Advantages

This is the house organ of the Rexall Company. It was first published in 1904 as the Rexall Review, but discontinued after a few months. In 1906 publication was resumed under the title of Rexall Advantages and continues up to the present. (See 2)

Rexall Review

This house organ of the Rexall Company which began publication in March, 1904 under the above title, was continued as Rexall Advantages. (See Rexall Advantages)

Rocky Mountain Druggist

This monthly journal began issue in April, 1888 in Denver, Colorado. It was discontinued with volume seven, October, 1894 but resumed issue in August, 1896. It is still published under the same title.

Its first editor was J. L. T. Davison who served until 1890, when J. J. Riethmann and Company became sole editors and publishers. In 1896 C. M. Ford became editor and the Rocky Moun<sup>tain</sup> Publishing Company, publishers. This is the only drug journal published in Colorado.

Rx Ray

This student publication of the New Jersey College of Pharmacy, Rutgers University, was first published in January, 1926. (See 2)

St. Louis Drug Intelligence

This was a journal published in St. Louis, Missouri from November, 1886 until March, 1887. Only six numbers of volume one were published. (See 1)

St. Louis Drug Market Reporter

This was the precursor of Meyer Druggist. (See Meyer Druggist)

St. Louis Druggist

This was the precursor of the National Druggist. (See National Druggist)

St. Louis Retail Druggist's Association Monthly Bulletin

Only one volume of this bulletin was issued at St. Louis, Missouri in 1911. (See 1, 2)

San Francisco and Pacific Druggist

This journal first appeared about 1895 or 1896 with Walter A. Taylor as editor.

It is at present the house organ of Caffin-Redington Company, wholesale druggists of San Francisco. (See 1,2,3)

San Talks

This journal, started in 1917, was published by the De Free Chemical Company, Chicago.

Selling and Service

This house organ of McKesson and Robbins appeared in 1930. (See 2)

The Show Globe

This monthly publication of the Blumauer-Frank Drug Company, Portland, Oregon, first appeared in 1911. John L. Jreome was editor. (See 2)

Southeastern Drug Journal

This journal was first published in November, 1926. It is published in Jacksonville, Florida and Atlanta, Georgia. The Dixie Pharmaceutical Journal combined with the Southeastern Drug Journal in 1928. (See 2, 4)

Southern Drug and Paint Review

This monthly journal was published by Lipman Brothers of Savannah, Georgia from 1887 to 1900. (See 3)

Southern Drug Journal

This journal was published in Atlanta, Georgia from 1902 to about 1906. (See 2)

Southern Druggist

This journal was published in Atlanta, Georgia from 1901 to 1908. (See 1)

Southern Druggist

This journal was published monthly for gratuitous distribution by Jesse R. Jones, Crystal Springs, Mississippi during 1870. (See 3)

Southern Journal of Medicine and Pharmacy

This journal was established in January, 1846 as a bi-monthly, edited by J. L. Smith M. D. and S. D. Sinkler M. D. and published by Burges and James at Charleston, South Carolina. J. L. Smith was succeeded by P. C. Gaillard in 1846 and H. W. De Saussure succeeded Dr. Sinkler in 1847.

Volumes one and two appeared under the title of Southern Journal of Medicine and Pharmacy. In 1847 the title was changed to Charleston Medical Journal and Review. This periodical was discontinued in 1877. (SEE 1,2)

Southern Journal of Pharmacy and Materia Medica

This journal first appeared in 1895, published at Nashville, Tennessee. It seems to have been discontinued in 1896. (See 1)

Southern Pharmaceutical Journal

This journal was established in 1908 by Dr. E. G. Eberle, present editor of the American Pharmaceutical Journal.

At present it is owned by W. H. Cousins and is edited by his daughter, Miss Margaret Cousins, (See 2)

#### The Southern Pharmacist

This was a monthly journal established at New Orleans, Louisiana in 1884 and discontinued in 1885. Fred Lascar was the editor. (See 3)

#### Southwest Druggist

The first number of this journal was published in March, 1909. It was published in Los Angeles, California. It was discontinued about 1910. (See 1)

#### Southwestern Druggist

This publication was published in Dallas, Texas from 1891 to 1904. (See 1)

#### The Spatula

This illustrated magazine for pharmacists was published in Boston from sometime in 1894 to September, 1925, when it merged into the Practical Druggist. (See 1)

#### The Spokesman

This monthly journal was the official organ of the Associated Pharmacists. It was first issued in 1916 at San Francisco, California. Place of publication was later changed to New York.

#### Squibb Message

This house organ of the E. R. Squibb Company was first published in 1922. It is published by the staff of E. R. Squibb and Sons for the professional pharmacist.

### Standard Remedies

This monthly journal began issue in Chicago in 1915. It is published by the Standard Remedies Publishing Company. (See 1)

### The Stirring Rod

This monthly journal was first published in 1906 in San Francisco by the Stirring Rod Publishing Company. From its inception until June, 1917, Mr. D. R. Rees was its editor. The place of publication was later changed to Los Angeles. It was the organ of the Retail Druggists' Association of San Francisco.

In 1928 this journal consolidated with the California Retail Drug Journal and the new publication which continues is known as the West Coast Druggist, published by the Keystone Publishing Company of Los Angeles. (See West Coast Druggist) (See 21)

### The Sunflower Druggists Bulletin

This journal, which began issue in November, 1916, at Marysville, Kansas was discontinued in the spring of 1927, being replaced by the Kansas Pharmaceutical <sup>Ass.</sup> News Letter in May of that year. It was published by and in the interests of

the Kansas Pharmaceutical Association. J. W. Giesburg was the first editor.

#### The Tennessee Pharmacal Gazette

This was the forerunner of the Pharmacal Gazette. (See Pharmacal Gazette)

#### Texas and Southwestern Druggist

This journal was first issued in May, 1886, under the title of Texas Druggist. It was the organ of the Texas Pharmaceutical Association, published at Waco.

In 1887 the title was changed to Texas and Southwestern Druggist. It was discontinued in 1888. (See 1)

#### Texas Druggist

This was the forerunner of Texas and Southwestern Druggist. (See Texas and Southwestern Druggist)

#### Texas Druggist

This journal is the official publication of the Texas Pharmaceutical Association. It is a continuation of a journal of the same title which was published by the Texas Drug Company, wholesale druggists, Dallas, from 1896 to 1900. At present the journal is published at Forney, Texas, edited by Walter D. Adams, secretary of the Texas Pharmaceutical Association. (See 2)

#### Therapeutic Digest

This bi-monthly journal of drug therapy is the house organ

of the William S. Merrell Chemical Company of Cincinnati, Ohio. It first appeared in 1905 and has been discontinued.

### File and Fill

This is the house organ of Eli Lilly and Company, Indianapolis, Indiana, at which place it has been published since February, 1905. From 1915 until 1928 it was published as a quarterly, appearing in February, May, August and November. Since 1929 it has been published six times each year, appearing in January, March, May, July, September and November.

It is in pamphlet form and contains from twenty to twenty-four pages. Its purpose is outlined in the following announcement. "To make you acquainted with Lilly products and the Lilly policy. In doing this we shall endeavor to make its pages entertaining, as well as instructive and helpful to proprietors and clerks."

H. S. Noel has been its editor from its foundation.

### Trade Letter

This was a publication issued weekly by the Groover-Stewart Drug Company of Jacksonville, Florida from September, 1927 to September 19, 1929, when it was discontinued and by Selling and Service, issued by McKesson and Robbins, Inc., 79 Cliff Street, New York.

The Groover-Stewart Drug Company is at present a subsidiary of the McKesson and Robbins combination. (See 2)

Trio: Therapeutics, Pharmacy, Biology

Eight volumes of this Journal were published in Detroit, Michigan from 1901 to 1908. (See 1)

#### Virginia Pharmacist

This monthly publication is published by the Virginia Pharmaceutical Association and the Board of Pharmacy. It was first issued in September, 1916. The present editors are A. L. J. Winne and W. F. Rudd.

#### Voice of the Retail Druggist

This journal, published by the Voice Publishing Company of New York, first appeared in April, 1906. It is the official organ of the American Druggists Syndicate. The title later changed to Voice Salesman. (See 2)

#### Voice Salesman

This was a continuation of Voice of the Retail Druggist. (See Voice of the Retail Druggist)

#### Washington State Retail Druggist

This was the title of the Western States Drug Journal from 1917 to 1921. (See Western States Drug Journal)

#### Weekly Drug Markets

This was the title under which the Drug and Cosmetic Industry was published from 1914 to 1916. (See Drug and Cosmetic Industry)

### Weekly Drug News

This journal is a continuation of the Oil and Drug News, published in New York from 1880 to 1882 when the title changed to Weekly Drug News, a technical and commercial journal devoted to drug, chemical and pharmaceutical interests. It was edited by Adams and Bartholomew. In 1883 it consolidated with the American Pharmacist, a journal established in 1882, the title remaining Weekly Drug News. This combined publication was published and edited by John M. Peters, New York, associate editor, Seward W. Williams.

In 1885 part of the Weekly Drug News was absorbed by the Oil, Paint and Drug Reporter and part by the Druggists' Circular. (See Weekly Drug News, June 27, 1885) (See 1,3)

### West Coast Druggist

This monthly journal is the combination of the Stirring Rod and the California Retail Drug Journal, which journals united in 1928. It is published by the Keystone Publishing Co Company at Los Angeles, California.

### Western Drug Record

This monthly journal was founded in November, 1884 by the firm of Woodward, Faxon and Company. It was published in Kansas City, Missouri, from 1885 until 1925.

The head of the firm, Mr. W. B. Woodward, was the first editor. Sometime afterward, and continuing for about ten years, Mr. F. A. Faxon acted as editor. Mr. H. D. Faxon followed him as editor.

In 1897, the name of the firm was changed to Faxon, Horton and Gallagher and sometime later to Faxon and Gallagher Drug Company. The journal was discontinued in 1925. (See Meyer Bros. Druggist, vol. 26, number 11, page 350) (See 1,2)

#### Western Drug Review

This monthly journal began issue in November, 1909 at Los Angeles, California. It is the house organ of McKesson-Western Wholesale Drug Company of Los Angeles. (See 2)

#### Western Druggist

This monthly publication was started in 1879 under the title of Druggist and Paint and Oil Review, a journal devoted to pharmacy, chemistry, materia medica and allied sciences. After March, 1880. the title was changed to the Druggist, under which title it was published until 1885, when it changed to the Western Druggist.

The Druggist and Paint and Oil Review was published by Chandler and Engelhart, edited by G. P. Engelhart, F. M. Goodman and C. F. Morey. Place of publication was Chicago. After the title changed to the Druggist G. P. Engelhart and E. B. Stuart became editors. In 1882 the publishers became G. P. Engelhart and Company of Chicago. A. G. Vogeler and C. S. N. Hallberg acted as assistant editors. After the change to the Western Druggist, it was the policy of the journal to withhold mention of editorial responsibility.

In 1886 the Western Druggist was consolidated with the

Pharmacist and Chemical Record, a journal which was established in Chicago in 1868 as the Pharmacist. (See the Pharmacist)

Under the title of Western Druggist the journal was published until 1928 when it consolidated with the Bulletin of Pharmacy, a monthly journal established in Detroit, Michigan, in 1891 and the combined journals are now published under the title of Drug Bulletin at Chicago. E. D. Irvine is the present publisher and manager of the Drug Bulletin, while A. L. Buzzell, editor of the Bulletin of Pharmacy continues as editorial writer. (See 2,3)

#### Western Druggist and Oil Gazette

This monthly journal was published by the Gazette Publishing Company at Lincoln, Nebraska, from 1885 to 1888.

(See 2)

#### Western Medical Advance and Progress in Pharmacy

This was an illustrated quarterly journal edited by W. H. Lathrop at Detroit, Michigan, the first numbers coming out about 1872. (See American Journal of Pharmacy, vol. 44, 1872, page 95)

#### Western Pennsylvania Retail Druggist

This journal was established in December, 1901 and is published by the Western Pennsylvania Retail Druggists' Association at Pittsburg, Pennsylvania.

#### Western State Druggist

This was the title under which volumes six to fourteen of the Western States Drug Journal were published. (See Western States Drug Journal)

#### Western States Drug Journal

Volumes one to five of this periodical were published under the title of Washington State Retail Druggist. In 1921 the title was changed to Western States Druggist and volumes six to fourteen were published under this title. Volume fifteen was published under the title of Western States Drug Journal. It was discontinued in January, 1927. (See 4)

#### Wholesale Druggist

This journal is a continuation of Drug Jobber's Salesman, purporting to be the only publication completely covering the wholesale drug trade. (See Drug Jobber's Salesman)

#### Wisconsin Druggist

This was a monthly journal issued at Reeseville, Wisconsin from January, 1903 until September, 1909. It was the official journal of the Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Association, edited by John H. Hughes. (See 1,2)

#### Wisconsin Druggists Exchange

This monthly publication, published in the interest of the Wisconsin druggists, by E. B. Heimstreet, was published from 1892 to 1902 at Janesville, Wisconsin. It was consol-

dated with the Northwestern Druggist in June, 1902. (See 1,3)

Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Journal

This monthly publication, published by the Pharmaceutical Publishing Company at Madison, Wisconsin, began issue in 1920 under the title of Journal of the Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Association. This title was later changed to Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Journal.

Herman P. Reif was managing editor. The journal seems to have been discontinued in 1922.

Women's Organization National Association Retail Druggists

This monthly publication, published in Philadelphia by the Women's Organization National Association Retail Druggists, was first issued in 1913.

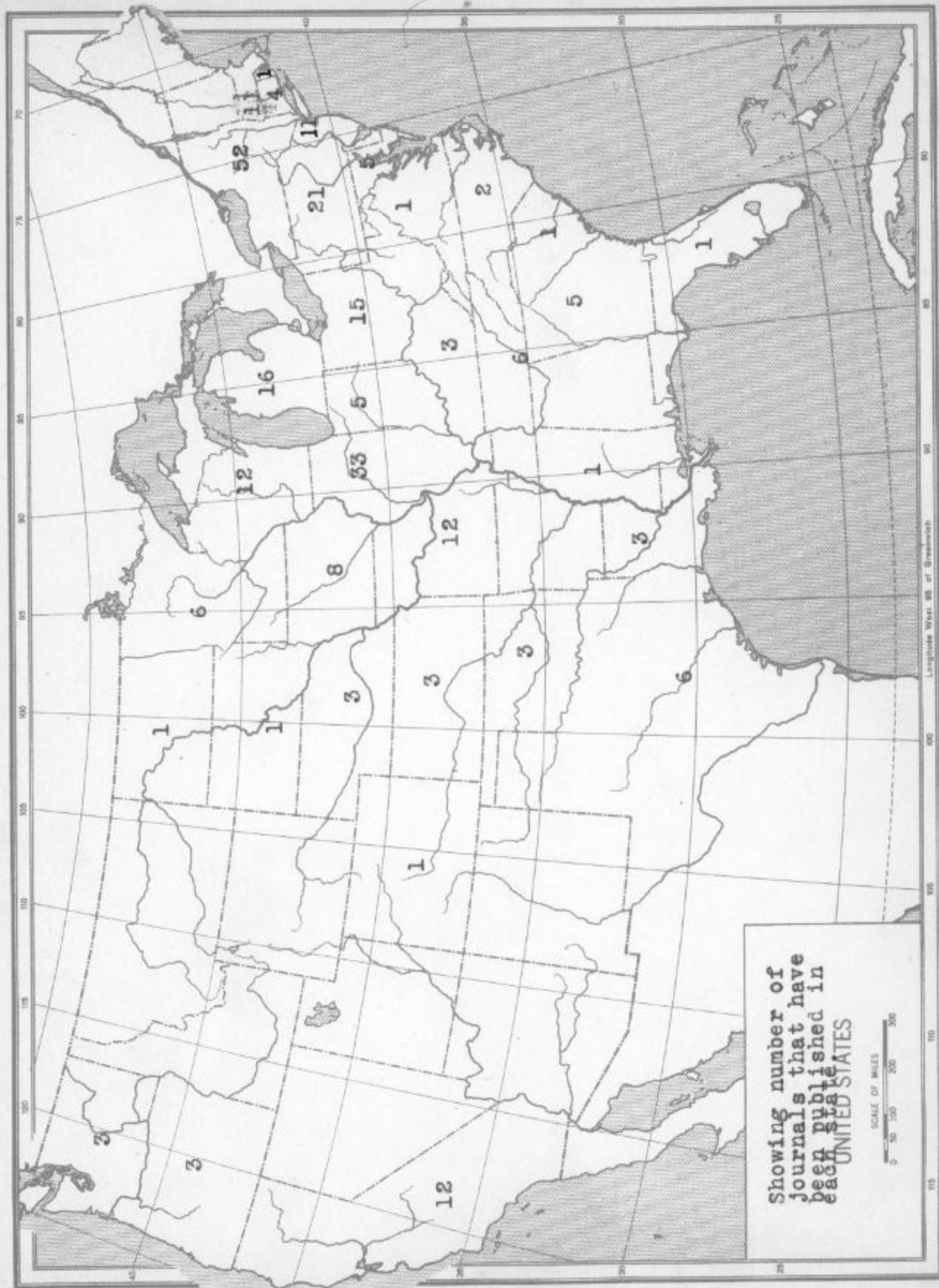

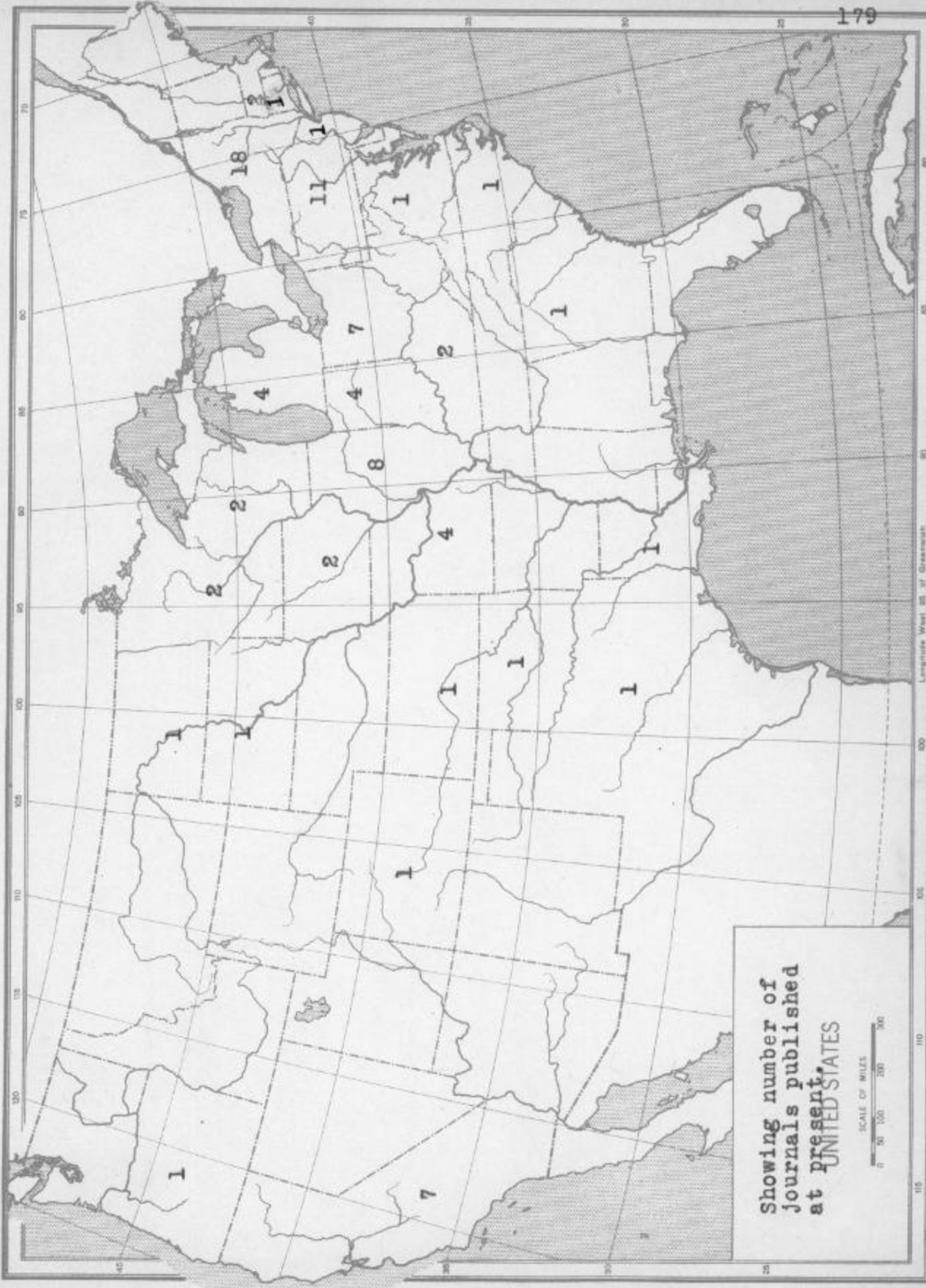
