With this issue, the *Gargoyle* begins its third year of publication. We continue to receive many favorable comments. We test its popularity by the number of address changes we receive; many alumni keep in touch with the Law School so that they will continue to receive the *Gargoyle*. While the pace is different and the focus changes during the summer, what follows on these pages will give you an idea of the amount of activity which continues in the Law School during the summer months. More students have been enrolled than in any year since the years right after World War II; there have been more courses, more institutes, and more visitors this year than ever before. Many students take part in various activities designed to add new dimensions to their legal education, or to speed their graduation from Law School. This trend toward year-round involvement in legal education will probably continue and accelerate. We are anxious to continue this development to the extent that our resources will permit, for it increases the efficiency and capacity of our operation.

The enrollment pressures continue. Despite our effort to maintain the balance between faculty, facilities and students, we are expecting a class of nearly 350 to enroll this September, an increase of 10% over last year. We will manage the load, but it will not be easy. The burden on the faculty will be excessive and will make it difficult to maintain the traditional quality of a Wisconsin legal education. There is no indication that this pressure will ease.

During the next couple of months, you will be urged—perhaps by several people — to support the Law School Fund. I can't tell you how



much the success of these Fund drives has meant to the Law School. In addition to the flexibility provided by the Fund, the tangible indication of the interest of alumni in the affairs of the School has been most heartening to the students, faculty and staff. We hope to be able to count on your continued generosity.
