Periodical literature is the cutting edge of women's scholarship, feminist theory, and much of women's culture. *Feminist Periodicals: A Current Listing of Contents* is published by the Office of the University of Wisconsin System Women's Studies Librarian on a quarterly basis with the intent of increasing public awareness of feminist periodicals. It is our hope that *Feminist Periodicals* will serve several purposes: to keep the reader abreast of current topics in feminist literature; to increase readers' familiarity with a wide spectrum of feminist periodicals; and to provide the requisite bibliographic information should a reader wish to subscribe to a journal or to obtain a particular article at her library or through interlibrary loan. (Users will need to be aware of the limitations of the new copyright law with regard to photocopying of copyrighted materials.)

Table of contents pages from current issues of major feminist journals are reproduced in each issue of *Feminist Periodicals*, preceded by a comprehensive annotated listing of all journals we have selected. As publication schedules vary enormously, not every periodical will have table of contents pages reproduced in each issue of *EP*. The annotated listing provides the following information on each journal:

1. Year of first publication.
2. Frequency of publication.
3. U.S. subscription price(s).
4. Subscription address.
5. Current editor.
6. Editorial address (if different from subscription address).
7. International Standard Serials Number (ISSN).
8. OCLC, Inc. Control Number.
9. Locations where the journal is held in the UW System.
10. Publications in which the journal is indexed.
11. Subject focus/statement of purpose of the journal.

Please note that in the actual text, only the numbers 1 to 11 are used to identify the different categories of information.

Our goal is to have represented in *FP* all English-language feminist periodicals with a substantial national or regional readership, with an emphasis on scholarly journals and small press offerings. We do not include publications which, though feminist in philosophy, do not focus solely on women's issues. Nor, with few exceptions, do we include newsstand magazines. We are also forced to omit periodicals which lack a complete table of contents. We encourage feminist serials to build a full table of contents into their regular format to facilitate the indexing feminist literature sorely needs.

Interested readers will find more complete information on feminist periodicals in *DWM: A Directory of Women's Media* published by the National Council for Research on Women (530 Broadway at Spring Street, New York, NY 10012); and in *Women's Periodicals and Newspapers: A Union List of the Holdings of Madison Area Libraries*, edited by James P. Danky, compiled by Maureen E. Hady, Barry Christopher, and Neill E. Strache (Boston: G.K. Hall, 1982).

Suggestions for improvements of *Feminist Periodicals* are gratefully received. We would particularly appreciate assistance from readers in the UW-System with our efforts to keep the holding information complete and up to date. Please let us know about new subscriptions, subscriptions we have overlooked, cancellations, or other pertinent information. *Feminist Periodicals* is also available on microfilm at the library of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin.

The Experience of Migration: A Relational Approach
in Therapy

Current thinking in mental health has begun to incorporate the centrality of culture in organizing people's lives, relational patterns, and meaning systems. However, not much is understood regarding the impact of living in two or more cultures due to immigration. This paper addresses the losses, trauma, and adjustment difficulties suffered by people who leave behind significant frames of reference and relational contexts that sustain their identifications. Attempts are made to provide a relational frame for understanding people's dilemmas within the therapeutic context. It is hoped this will help to expand providers' frame of reference when servicing immigrants and their families.

This paper presents a method of helping couples work through blocks to connection by expanding their awareness of context. By "context" we mean the cultural assumptions and prejudices that are implicit in societal belief systems. Couples are often unconscious of the negative impact that culturally generated beliefs about status-laden dimensions like race, class, gender and sexual life style can have on the relationship. Without an awareness of context, couples develop narrow, problem-saturated stories that involve blaming each other. Our method of eliciting awareness of context helps couples join together and develop mutual understanding and empathy.

The Ethics of Care and Justice

1

Margaret Moore

This article argues that the relationship between liberal justice and care has been conceived incorrectly. Liberal justice theorists tend to relegate care to the personal sphere and thereby conceptualize it as a form of self-interested action. Care theorists, such as Carol Gilligan, have recognized that the language of care tends to be ignored by justice theorists, but they have tended to incorrectly identify justice and care as two genderized moralities. This article argues that, in fact, justice theories, such as Rawls' argument in A Theory of Justice, presuppose care. This article concludes that liberal justice theory should incorporate its own dependence on the 'ethics of care' into its theory, and work toward a conception of justice and care as reciprocal and interdependent.

American Indian Women Leaders, Public Policy,
and the Importance of Gender and Ethnic Identity

American Indian women are playing an increasingly important role as policymakers in state, local, and tribal politics. Despite their activity and impact, however, few studies examine their political agendas or public policy preferences. One exception is Melanie McCoy's 1992 study of female tribal leaders published in Women & Politics. Like McCoy, we explore the research questions: What are the public policy agendas of American Indian women leaders? What do they wish to accomplish? What motivates them? Does their gender and/or ethnic identity have an influence on their political participation?

Whereas McCoy's sample consists of female tribal officials from across the United States, we interviewed Indian women in elected or appointed positions in state, local, and tribal government in New Mexico. In her study, McCoy concluded that "the disadvantaged condition of [Indians appears to] have more influence on [leaders'] political behavior than either gender or ethnicity" (1992, 57). However, we find that both gender and ethnic identity are significant influences for Indian women holding public office in New Mexico. Furthermore, the difference in our findings is due to the cultural and structural restrictions placed on women by the more traditional tribes in New Mexico.

Liberal Theory and Feminist Politics

We live in an age where—whether we like it or not—questions of morality hold center stage and public attention. Those who do not speak in the language of constructive ethics are losing constituencies to those who do. In such an environment where good and evil are the dominant topics of conversation, liberal feminism, because it is not theoretically oriented toward such questions, cannot always participate in the central debates. I am not suggesting that liberal feminism should be thoroughly dismissed. Rather, if we are to increase the viability of feminist politics at the turn of the twenty-first century, liberal feminism cannot continue to serve as the dominant representation of the women's movement. Feminism in America is strong precisely because it is comprised of many different, sometimes competing strands of arguments, strategies, and ideologies. My goal in this essay is to demonstrate why liberal feminism is both important yet insufficient as the sole foundation for feminist politics.

Beyond the "Great Divide": Women in Partisan Politics
 Before and After the Federal Suffrage Amendment 59
Diane Sainsbury

A prevailing interpretation in the literature on women and partisan politics is that the federal suffrage amendment constituted a great divide. This article challenges this interpretation by examining the continuities in women's involvement in political parties and by focusing on the significance of women's early enfranchisement in the equal suffrage states. Empirically, the analysis shows how early woman suffrage shaped the dynamics of the struggle for the vote and women's entry into the parties at the national level. Theoretically, it questions the "separate spheres model" of women's and men's political involvement which informs much theorizing on gender and parties in a historical perspective.
