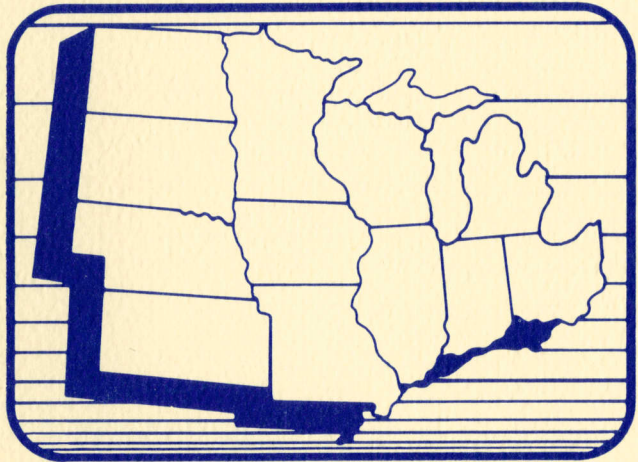

Material in a wide range of formats—including articles, review essays, proceedings of seminars, and case studies of specific archival projects or functions—will be considered for publication. Guidelines for authors of articles and case studies are available upon request from the editorial board chair.

Manuscripts should be sent to the board chair, Frank Boles, Bentley Historical Library, University of Michigan, 1150 Beal Avenue, Ann Arbor, MI 48109. The editorial board uses the current edition of *Chicago Manual of Style* as the standard for style, including footnote format. Decisions on manuscripts will be rendered within ten weeks of submission.
