Objectives

The Constitution states "The objectives of this Society are to promote the advancement of the knowledge and application of value engineering."

Fulfillment of Objectives (Article II, National Bylaws)

Section 1. To achieve the objectives, the Society shall:

- (A) Advance the art and science of value engineering and the allied practices and disciplines which sustain the economic strength of our nation and its industry.
- (B) Foster value engineering education in industry, Government, and educational institutions.
- (C) Encourage original work and research in the theory and application of value work.
- (D) Promote effective effort through improved communications among those who are responsible for value work.
- (E) Promote high levels of professional standards, practices, and conduct.
- (F) Broaden the usefulness and application of value work through cooperation with other engineering, technical, and business societies.
- (G) Encourage a high standard of service to the community and nation.
- (H) Provide awards or recognition to those making significant contributions in advancing the art and science of value engineering.

Philosophy

The Honors and Awards program is designed to promote the foregoing objectives and to recognize and reward attainment of these objectives by members and other deserving individuals. There is a series of Honors and Awards to inspire individuals to seek the effective fulfillment of the above purposes.

The Honors and Awards program is quite properly designed to offer encouragement and reward to individuals for attainment in each of the foregoing areas. It recognizes that there are degrees of attainment and the Honors and Awards reflect this. Criteria are established to properly recognize degrees of attainment in terms of the area of achievement and the scope of achievement.

Because the Board of Directors is charged by the constitution and bylaws with the responsibility of fulfilling the purposes and objectives of SAVE it has the sole responsibility to authorize the conception of Honors and Awards, the criteria for selection of recipients of any and all awards, the nomination and review procedures for individuals to be honored, and the final approval, within the limits of the constitution of recipients of such awards as will fulfill the purposes of SAVE. To do this, it has created the Individual Honors and Awards committee to assist it in this responsibility.

To this group it has delegated authority and responsibility

1. To review needs of such Honors and Awards as may further the purposes of SAVE.
2. To recommend such Honors and Awards to the Honors and Awards Review Board as may further the purposes of SAVE.
3. To recommend to the Board of Directors criteria for individual Honors and Awards which properly reflect degrees of attainment of the established purposes of SAVE.
4. To solicit nominations and full substantiating information from the membership and others for those individuals who by their actions have furthered the purpose of SAVE.
5. To review such nominations and substantiating information received against the supporting criteria for the various Honors and Awards.
6. To report to the Honors and Awards Review Board those individuals who have been nominated for recognition and to designate the extent to which the activities of the Nominees, as shown by the substantiating data submitted, have met or failed to meet the established criteria for authorized Honors and Awards.

Philosophy (continued)

7. To recommend to the Honors and Awards Review Board suitable Honors and Awards to be given to those who may be designated as recipients.
8. Draft and recommend appropriately worded citations for the President of SAVE, or the Honors and Awards Director for presentation of the awards.

HONORS AND AWARDS FOR INDIVIDUALS

A. HONORS AND AWARDS FOR WHICH MEMBERS OF SAVE ARE ELIGIBLE

1. Honorary Member

This award has been established to recognize those individuals of professional eminence who have contributed significantly to the advancement and implementation of value engineering through their responsibilities and authority in industry, government, education and professional societies.

This award is made only to persons of acknowledged professional eminence who have made outstanding contributions in the field of Value Engineering which have significantly increased the effectiveness of human endeavor, and who have met other constitutional criteria.

Review of nominations is made normally once each year by the Board of Directors of recommendations from the Honors and Awards Review Board. While not limited by any fixed ceilings, it would be considered unusual for the Honors and Awards Review Board to recommend this award to more than three persons in any year because of the high honor of this recognition.

2. Life Member

A life member shall be an outstanding leader in the Value Engineering profession who has made substantial contributions to the profession. At the time of his advancement, a life member shall have been engaged as a professional in the practice and/or teaching of Value Engineering for at least (15) years (continuously or cumulatively) and shall have been in the grade of Senior Member or Fellow Member for at least (10) years.

Past National Presidents of the Society shall be admitted to Life Membership at the end of their term of service as President.

3. Fellow

A Fellow shall be an individual of professional distinction in the practice or teaching of value engineering. A Fellow shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the Society, including the right to vote and to hold National and Local Chapter office.

At the time of his advancement, a Fellow shall have been engaged in the practice and/or teaching of value engineering for at least fifteen (15) years (continuously or cumulatively) and shall have been in the grade of Senior Member or Emeritus Member for at least five (5) of these years.

4. Emeritus Member

This grade of membership shall be only by transfer from the grade of Senior Member.

The Award is made to senior members who have over a long period of time devoted substantial and continuous efforts to the evaluation of Value Engineering as a profession and/or growth of SAVE and who have retired from active professional activities in teaching, research, consulting, government, or business.

Review of nominations is made normally once each year by the Board of Directors of recommendations made by the Honors and Awards Review Board. While not limited by any ceiling the Board will not normally submit more than one recommendation from each chapter to the Board of Directors for action during any one year.

5. Distinguished Service Award

This award may be made to any member of SAVE who has rendered some outstanding service to his society in one of the following categories: SAVE activities, industrial activity, government activity or educational activity.

Not more than four Awards, one in each category shall be made each year. The Board of Directors will review nominations normally once each year. The Honors and Awards Review Board will report all nominations to the Board of Directors, together with its recommendations for the four individuals considered most worthy of such recognition. Only four nominees from those reported may be selected, and then only when there is a nominee who has contributed truly distinguished service to the Society.

6. Best Technical Value Engineering Paper Award

To be determined by the officers and editors of the Society's official publications.

7. Past Presidents Award

- (1) In recognition of the guidance, effort and achievements of the President of SAVE, a special award in appreciation of untiring efforts has been established.
- (2) Each President of SAVE upon leaving office shall be presented with a plaque in recognition of his service.
- (3) A permanent plaque shall be established in the National office of SAVE commemorating the services of its Presidents. The name of each past President shall be engraved thereon as he retires from office.

- (4) As the term of the President nears its end, the Director of Honors and Awards shall order the approved plaque with proper inscription. Upon receipt of it he will give it to the President-elect for presentation.
- (5) The President-elect shall, upon assuming office at the end of the Annual Conference, present the Award to the recipient.
- (6) The Director of Honors and Awards shall be responsible for having the permanent plaque at the National office properly inscribed upon succession of the President-elect to office.

8. Value Engineer of the Year

This is an award for hard work, effectiveness, enthusiasm and collective contribution to the advancement of the SAVE during the past year. It is not to be awarded to levels of President of local chapters or to national executive post incumbents of the past year. It is designed to recognize and stimulate effort in the rank and file of the organization and in committee effort.

B. HONORS AND AWARDS FOR WHICH INDIVIDUALS AND INSTITUTIONS NOT A PART OF SAVE ARE ELIGIBLE

1. Award for Outstanding Achievement in Management

The Award is established to suitably recognize executives who have significantly contributed to the Value Engineering profession by creating a climate within their operating units which permits Value Engineering techniques to be perfected and used with outstanding results. Such executives shall normally be the president, vice-president, or board chairman with the line responsibility of an industrial, government, or educational enterprise who can be held accountable for the stimulation of such a climate.

As an alternative in special situations where a Staff Executive has strong influence on operating policy a Senior Staff Executive may be the recipient of this award. He would normally be of Staff Vice-Presidential level or the equivalent in governmental or educational institutions.

It is recognized that in making this award that SAVE is indirectly honoring a business, governmental or educational institution, and consideration is given to respect and esteem which the total institution has displayed for the techniques associated with Value Engineering.

The Award cannot be granted to any executive from a company represented on the Board of Directors of SAVE or Honors and Awards Review Board at the time the selections are made.

Nominees for the award are normally reviewed by the Board of Directors once each year of recommendations made by the Honors and Awards Review Board. While there is no imposed limitations on the number of recipients of this award the Honors and Awards Review Board does not normally recommend more than two individuals for this honor in any one year.

2. Presidential Citation

This award is established to suitably recognize those persons who have contributed significantly to the advancement of SAVE. Nominees for the Award are normally reviewed by the Board of Directors once each year of recommendations made by the President.

3. Student Award

This award is to be determined annually by the President of the host chapter or chapters for the annual meeting. Its purpose is two-fold; first, to recognize a definite contribution at the University level of a graduate or undergraduate student who has contributed by theses or written material for publication articles advancing knowledge in the field of value engineering; second, to stimulate attention and effort at the University level in Value Engineering. The student should live close enough to ensure that he can be present at the national convention to receive this award in person. Also, it should help to develop interest by the local press and educators in Value Engineering.

C. CRITERIA FOR AWARDS TO INDIVIDUALS

The criteria seek to clearly indicate the particular event(s) and circumstances(s) by which the Honor is granted. It seeks to identify the particular area of activity which the individual or institution has achieved eminence and to measure the depth and breadth of the effect of the activity. The criteria in all cases reflect the limitations imposed as measurement by the constitution and bylaws as the case may be. The criteria in all cases must be accepted by a three-fourths vote of the full Board of Directors.

The philosophy of criteria for all awards made to individuals is to measure the partial attainment (in depth, breadth, geographical effect, etc.) of the criteria established for the bestowing of honors on individuals.

1. General Criteria for all Awards to Individuals

Each nominee shall be considered on the strength of his record as compiled and submitted by the nominator to the Director of Honors and Awards in terms of:

- (1) Unique or pattern-setting developments in the management of Value Engineering in any activity.
- (2) Unique or original development or application of Value Engineering methodology or philosophy.

- (3) Inventions or patents involving technical or other innovations which would make work--any type of work-- more effective in terms of cost, drudgery, quality or any other key performance feature.
- (4) Development of a generally applicable model of any kind, such as a conceptual, mathematical or probability model, process or other design that can serve as a model for wider application elsewhere from existing but limited applications.
- (5) Conduct and publication of original research in Value Engineering.
- (6) Publication of original work through any information medium (including magazines, TV, lectures, etc.)
- (7) Promotion and dissemination of information about Value Engineering.
- (8) Humanitarian, community or public service (including hospital boards, governmental, schools, etc.) such as
 - in local communities or regions, throughout the U.S.A. and Canada
 - or through international activities
 - or other comparable work
- (9) Services to the profession as such (not including professional societies) such as
 - a teacher, educator or lecturer in Value Engineering
 - or in inter-disciplinary work (utilization of other knowledge in value engineering work or vice versa)
- (10) Service to SAVE, such as long and arduous effort to improve SAVE,
 - editorial efforts
 - important committee or task force participation
 - and chairmanship
 - important society "Directorships"
 - elective office
- (11) And such other specific criteria as established by the constitution or Board of Directors.

2. Specific Criteria for all Awards to Individuals

(1) Criteria for Honorary Member

The nominating information will specifically substantiate contribution in not less than five of the first ten points of the general criteria, and the data will clearly substantiate that in at least three of these criteria the contribution must be considered to be of the highest caliber and be nationally or internationally recognized.

In addition, the data must substantiate that the nominee

- a. is not less than forty years of age at time of election
- b. has had responsible charge for not less than ten years of important engineering or management work, and be qualified to direct, conceive, plan or operate value work

or

has had responsible charge for not less than ten years of important industrial, business, construction, education, editorial, or engineering society activity, requiring the knowledge and experience gained from engineering training and experience.

(2) Criteria for Life Member

A Life Member shall be an outstanding leader in the Value Engineering profession who has made substantial contributions to the profession.

The nominating information will specifically substantiate contribution in not less than 5 of the 10 points in the General Criteria and at least 3 must be of highest caliber and responsible charge of important activities for not less than 10 years.

In addition, the data must substantiate that the nominee

- a. is not less than forty years of age at time of election
- b. is nationally recognized as a professional in the practice or teaching of Value Engineering for at least (15) years (continuously or cumulatively) and shall have been in the grade of Senior Member or Fellow Member for at least (10) years.

Past National Presidents of the Society shall be admitted to Life Membership at the end of their term of service as President.

(3) Criteria for Fellow

A Fellow shall be an outstanding leader in the Value Engineering profession who has made substantial contributions to the profession.

The nominating information will specifically substantiate contribution in not less than four of the first ten points in the general criteria, and the data will clearly substantiate that the contributions are outstanding and are nationally recognized.

In addition, the data must substantiate that the nominee

- a. is not less than forty years of age at time of election
- b. is nationally recognized as a professional in the practice or teaching of Value Engineering for at least (15) years (continuously or cumulatively) and shall have been in the grade of Senior Member or Emeritus Member for at least (5) of these years.

(4) Criteria for Emeritus Member

This grade of membership shall be made for substantial and long devoted service to the interests and purposes of SAVE.

The nominating information will specifically substantiate contribution in not less than two of the first ten points in the general criteria, and the data will clearly substantiate that the contributions are substantial and at least regionally recognized.

In the case of nominees previously transferred to membership of the grade of Emeritus, Fellow, or Honorary Member, the contributions mentioned above must be in addition to those for which they were honored by transfer to grade of Emeritus, Fellow, or Honorary Member.

(5) Distinguished Service Award

This honor is granted to members of SAVE who have rendered outstanding service to the Society in one of the following categories:

SAVE

The member who has distinguished himself by his outstanding contributions to the Society's growth and management.

INDUSTRIAL

The member who has distinguished himself by his outstanding contributions in industrial application of value engineering.

GOVERNMENT

The member who has distinguished himself by his outstanding contributions in governmental applications of value engineering.

EDUCATION

The member who has distinguished himself by his outstanding contributions in the development of techniques for motivating, teaching and implementing value engineering.

The nominating information will specifically substantiate contribution in not less than three of the first ten points including item (10) in the general criteria, and the data will clearly substantiate that the contributions are outstanding with respect to at least two of the points and are nationally recognized.

(6) Award for Outstanding Achievement in Management

This Award is made to recognize individuals and indirectly those institutions for which they have executive responsibility, who have significantly contributed to the Value Engineering Profession by creating a climate within their operating units which permits the techniques associated with Value Engineering to be perfected and used with outstanding results.

The nominating information will specifically substantiate contribution in not less than four of the first nine points in the general criteria, and the data will clearly substantiate that the contributions are at least nationally recognized with respect to points (1) or (2) and suitably outstanding on other points offered.

In addition, the data must substantiate that the nominee

- a. has such executive responsibility that his leadership over a period of at least five years has been a substantial influence in creating the climate for growth and utilization of Value Engineering. For this reason the nominee will normally be a president, vice president or operating Board Chairman of an important industrial concern, or the equivalent in responsibility in governmental or educational institutions or have staff responsibility with strong influence on operating policy.
- b. The Award cannot be made to any individual from a company, governmental agency, or educational institution represented on the Board of Directors of SAVE or the Honors and Awards Review Board at the time of nomination and selection.

(7) Criteria for Value Engineer of the Year

This is an award for hardwork, effectiveness, enthusiasm and collective contribution to the advancement of the SAVE during the past year. It is not to be awarded to levels of President of local chapters or to national executive post incumbents. It is designed to recognize and stimulate activity in the rank and file of the organization.

Indicate each working committee in which he participated and assignments of note. Indicate the approximate number of working hours devoted to each activity. Show the results achieved directly attributable to this individual's efforts in the area of value engineering training, research, publicity, development, management, reporting and motivation.

The nominating information will specifically substantiate contribution in not less than three of the first ten points including item (10) in the general criteria, and the data will clearly substantiate that the contributions are outstanding with respect to at least two of the points and are nationally recognized.

D. SCHEDULE FOR HONORS AND AWARDS ACTIVITIES FOR INDIVIDUALS

The schedule for Honors and Awards activities is on an annual basis and the following program will not be deviated from except by particular order of the Board of Directors.

Announcement of Honors and Awards - June 1

- (1) Material requesting nominations will be distributed to
 - a. The Editor of the SAVE Communications and other Publications.
 - b. Each Chapter President.
 - c. All Vice Presidents and Directors of Committees.
 - d. All other members of the Board of Directors.

by the Director of Honors and Awards by June 1 through the National Business Office.
- (2) The announcement will point out necessity for full substantiating data with each nomination.
- (3) The announcement will list awards for which nominations are being requested.
- (4) Announcement will state general purpose of each award and give reference to specific criteria of this manual.
- (5) Announcement will give available locations of this manual for reference
 - a. National Business Office
 - b. Regional Vice Presidents
 - c. Chapter Presidents
 - d. Others as established by Board of Directors
- (6) Announcement will specifically state to whom nominations are to be sent --- Director, Individual Honors and Awards Committee, c/o Executive Secretary, SAVE, 2550 Hargrove Drive L-205, Smyrna, Georgia 30080.
- (7) Announcement will clearly state that the nominations will close as of October 31 and that those received after that date will only be considered for the next following year.
- (8) Announcement will clearly state that nominations are welcomed from an individual, group, or organization, with the only requirement being that the nominations be fully substantiated in accordance with the criteria.
- (9) The prominent display of the announcement in the June issue of the SAVE Communications and other SAVE publications is expected.
- (10) Only one nomination is required for any award, but endorsements will strengthen the consideration by the Review Board.
- (11) A follow-up announcement will be made in the SAVE Communications in August and September.

2. Receipts of Nominations June 1 through October 31

- (1) All nominations will be labeled confidential and mailed to:

- (2) Nominations will be opened by the Executive Secretary only.
- (3) Ten copies will be made of each nomination and mailed as follows:
- a. One to the Chairman of the Individual Honors and Awards Review Board.
 - b. One to each of the other members of the Individual Honors and Awards Review Board.
 - c. One to the Director of the Individual Honors and Awards Committee and one to each member of the Committee.

The original will be filed by the Executive Secretary.

- (4) The Executive Secretary and all others concerned will treat all nominations as confidential material. Nominators should treat their nominations likewise.
- (5) Any subsequent correspondence between the Director of Individual Honors and Awards and the Nominator relating to amplification or extension of data with respect to nominations will be handled as above. Forms will be supplied by the Director of Individual Honors and Awards.

3. Closing of Nominations - October 31

- (1) Nominations received after October 31 will be held by the Executive Secretary for distribution between May 1 and October 31 of the following year as detailed above. The Executive Secretary will so notify nominators.
- (2) The Director of the Individual Honors and Awards Committee on October 31 will by letter notify the
- a. The executive Secretary
 - b. Members of the Individual Honors and Awards Committee
 - c. Members of the Honors and Awards Review Board
 - d. The President

that the nominations for the year are closed.

- (3) Respecting the wishes and convenience of the members of the Review Board, the Director will call for a full meeting of the Board after October 31 but before March 1, at which meeting the nominations will be reviewed.

4. Meeting of the Individual Honors and Awards Review Board - Between October 31 and March 1

- (1) All actions of the Board require a majority affirmative vote of the full Board in session.
- (2) The Review Board will review all nominations and on the basis of the substantiating data before it, vote on recommendations to the Board of Directors.
- (3) The Director of Individual Honors and Awards will sit with the Board as an ex officio member (without a vote). However, in event that one member of the Honors and Awards Review Board is absent from the meeting, the Director of Individual Honors and Awards will be a voting member.
- (4) The Review Board may, when reviewing the data supplied to substantiate a particular nomination, make a decision to consider the individual for one of the other awards more in keeping with the data supplied.

The Board may when reviewing data on nominations make a decision that further clarification or extension of data is needed for final action and defer action until it obtains such data and reviews it at its next regular meeting. It may then, at any time, decide that the candidate is not suited for consideration and close the file.

- (5) The Review Board will prepare a report of its actions, including a summary of the nominating data of each nominee who meets the criteria, together with its recommendation for action. This report will be addressed to the Board of Directors and deposited with the Executive Secretary as soon as possible following its meeting but not later than March 15.
