Periodical literature is the cutting edge of women's scholarship, feminist theory, and much of women's culture. *Feminist Periodicals: A Current Listing of Contents* is published by the Office of the University of Wisconsin System Gender & Women's Studies Librarian on a quarterly basis with the intent of increasing public visibility of feminist periodicals. It is our hope that *Feminist Periodicals* will serve several purposes: to keep the reader abreast of current topics in feminist literature; to increase readers' familiarity with a wide spectrum of feminist periodicals; and to provide the requisite bibliographic information should a reader wish to subscribe to a journal or to obtain a particular article at her library or through interlibrary loan.

Users will need to be aware of the limitations of copyright law with regard to photocopying of copyrighted materials.

Table of contents pages from current issues of major feminist journals are reproduced in each issue of *Feminist Periodicals*, followed by a comprehensive annotated listing of all journals we have selected. As publication schedules vary enormously, not every periodical will have table of contents pages reproduced in each issue of FP. The annotated listing provides the following information on each journal:

1. Year of first publication.
2. Frequency of publication.
3. Subscription prices (print only; for online prices, consult publisher).
4. Current editor.
5. Email address.
6. International Standard Serial Number (ISSN).
7. OCLC, Inc. Control Number.
8. Selected publications in which the journal is indexed.
9. Selected full text products in which publication appears or vendor intermediaries who make the full text available.
10. Subject focus/statement of purpose of the journal.

Please note that in the actual text, only the numbers 1 to 10 are used to identify the different categories of information.

Our goal in *Feminist Periodicals* is to represent English-language periodicals from around the world that focus on gender, women's studies, or women's issues. Generally, we do not include mainstream newsstand magazines. We are also unable to include periodicals that lack a complete table of contents. We encourage feminist serials to build a full table of contents into their regular format to facilitate possible inclusion in FP and indexing elsewhere.
