A brief history of inter-scholastic
athletics at Westby High School.

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

In view of the fact that records of Westby High School's Inter-scholastic contests are very incomplete, an attempt will be made in this study to bring them up to date. A copy of this paper will be placed in our permanent athletic record file. It is anticipated that the publishing of this paper in the local papers will bring to light some of the missing data.

Purpose of Study

The purpose of this study is to bring up to date the records of all Inter-scholastic sports in which Westby High School has participated. These sports are as follows: boy's basketball, girl's basketball, football, baseball, track and wrestling.

In addition, the study will present some historical background of each of the activities, as well as some information on coaches who have served at Westby.

Sources of Information

Sources of information included checking school annuals, old score books and newspaper files, both local and state. In addition graduates in periods where our information was missing were interviewed. Former coaches have been very willing to help us obtain information. A questionnaire

was sent to each of the living former coaches. They were all returned. No specific results of athletic contests were obtained, but some interesting sidelights were revealed. The largest gap in our history occurs during the years of 1933, 1934 and 1935, when no school annuals were published. The reason for not publishing annuals in those years was that they were the depression years. Even in some years when annuals were published their records were incomplete.

In trying to fill in the data from those missing years, a probable list of schools against which Westby ordinarily competed was compiled. These schools were asked to check their records against Westby. Excellent cooperation was received in this search, but in most cases their records were less complete than Westby's. Fire has apparently taken a toll of a number of school records in this area, not only athletic but scholastic.

The first sport to be introduced in the history of the school was basketball. The second chapter will be devoted to that activity.

CHAPTER II

BASKETBALL

The history of basketball in Westby High School dates back to the year 1910. This was the year when the first high school students enrolled. George Godfrey, then Principal of the school, started basketball with just freshmen participating. A game was played with a freshmen team from Viroqua High School which resulted in a victory for Westby.

These same boys with the addition of another high school class continued practicing under George Godfrey the following year. One game was played with Viola, which resulted in a victory for Viola.

The third year Principal L.E. Weiland came to the school. Under his managership and the coaching of Sig Ramsland and Sam Neprud basketball fortunes continued. The school became a member of the Wisconsin Athletic Association. This made it possible for them to compete with other schools of the state. A total of 13 games were played that year, Westby winning seven, losing five and tying one. In 1914, Westby became a full-fledged four-year high school. Le Roy Peterson, assistant Principal, was appointed coach of the team. This team played nine games, winning three and losing six.

An expression of the attitude of the students of that time follows.

Good spirit was shown throughout the season and the games were a success financially. 'Hard luck', if there is such a thing, was with the team. Many of the games that went to the opposition were lost by the smallest of margins. The school stood by its team, and showed excellent spirit and enthusiasm.¹

A member of that first team pointed out that Le Roy Peterson, their coach, insisted on an abundance of running for pre-season conditioning. Weeks before basketball season started their coach would lead them in three or four mile jaunts into the country.²

Athletic progress continued and this summary is noted:

Much has been done within the past two years to increase the enjoyment to be gotten from participation in athletics. Of major importance was the installation of shower baths which have contributed a great deal to the pleasure and physical good involved in basketball. Coupled with this was the the equipment of the dressing room with individual lockers provided with combination locks for the members of both the first and second teams, and the purchase of an adequate supply of Turkish towels. The capacity of the gymnasium was greatly increased by arranging bleachers along the sides and one end which have at times granted standing room to fully two hundred fifty rooters, with the possibility of squeezing in one more. Medical care for bruises and various minor injuries has been provided for those hurt in practice or contest games, and a bountiful supply of liniment, collodian, etc. has been kept on hand at all times. Players have not lacked for the services of unprofessional masseurs, and a rub table was a part of the equipment of the dressing room.³

The first record of tournament play came in 1917. Westby was invited to participate in a tournament under the direction of Heineman and Keeler of La Crosse Normal. The games were scheduled to be played in the Normal Gymnasium. Due to an epidemic of scarlet fever in La Crosse the tournament was moved to the Y. M. C. A. gymnasium in Winona. Westby placed fourth in this tournament. An interesting note was that they played two games in one day and were scheduled to play a third until their coach decided they were physically unfit to compete. The game was rescheduled for a later date at the La Crosse Normal Gymnasium.

The first banquet honoring a Westby athletic team was held in 1917. Arthur Thorson, coach of the boys' team and Edna Pease, coach of the girls' basketball team entertained the two teams at a party in the Opera Hall.

Records are incomplete for 1918. The highlights of this season was an invitation to play at Prairie du Chien. This trip was the high light of the season as it also included a trip to Madison. All travel in those days was done by rail or bob-sled. The Southeastern Railway which ran through Westby is mentioned often in their travels. Trips to towns like Cashton, Ontario and La Farge were made by sled.

The flu epidemic took its toll in 1919. The Board of Health cancelled all but one game that year. Westby was de-

feated by Cashman in this game. A number of intra-squad games were played during the season.

One of the best school records was established by the 1920 team when they won seven out of eight scheduled games, losing only to Bangor. The team was invited to participate in a tournament only to lose to both Hillsboro and Baraboo. A forfeited game from Viroqua appears in the 1920 records.

E.J. Mutch became the first full time coach of the Westby Norsemen. He became a member of the faculty in 1922, teaching science and physical education. The following comment on the new coach is noted:

A good deal of the successful work done by the boys this season was without doubt due to the untiring efforts of Mr. Mutch, our coach. The boys were efficiently drilled in all departments of the game. His presence at the games gave them the desired confidence in themselves, which insured them a good chance for victory.⁴

Percy Aaberg took over coaching duties in 1923 and acted as coach until 1928 when he was named Principal. W.E. Jersey took over in 1928 for one season. He was succeeded by Edwin Peterson in 1929 who served as head coach through 1936 when he moved to Viroqua to take over as coach. During Peterson's tenure Westby became a member of the Monroe-Vernon Basketball League, which comprised the following

teams: Westby, Cashton, Ontario, Wilton, Kendall and Norwalk.

W.G. Wandschneider took over the coaching duties in 1937 and continued until mid-season of 1941 when Arthur Bronson took over the coaching reins. The first league championship was won in 1938. Another highlight during this period was the building of a new gymnasium. Westby met Viroqua, Nov. 28, 1939, in the dedication game of the new gymnasium. The game was a thriller with Westby winning 21 to 19. During Bronson's tenure Westby became a member of the West-Central Basketball League. This league consisted of the following teams: Westby, Viroqua, Tomah, Sparta and Mauston.

Guerdon Brewer followed Bronson and coached all sports for two seasons. During the 1945 season Westby gained the finals in the regional basketball tournament by defeating Richland Center and Mauston, only to be defeated by Tomah. Tomah eventually went to the state tournament that year. Brewer was followed by Elmo Gulsvig who coached from 1946 through the 1951 season with the exception of 1947 when Ted Jacobson handled the team. Since 1952 three coaches have handled the basketball chores, Harold Diers from 1952 through 1954, Calvin Rasmussen 1955 through 1957. Clayton Mitchell took over in 1958 and is presently serving as basketball coach.

In 1953, the West Central Basketball League was dissolved. Westby joined forces with the Juneau County League

which was composed of the following teams: Westby, New Lisbon, Elroy, Hillsboro, Camp Douglas, Necedah and Wonewoc. Camp Douglas withdrew from this league in 1956 and Necedah in 1957. This left only five teams in the league and as the Monroe-Vernon League had only five teams a movement was started to combine the leagues. This was accomplished and play in the new league started during the 1958-1959 season. The new league is known as the Scenic Central Basketball League.

A number of incidents have occurred in the forty nine year span of basketball history in the Westby High School. Much was said and written about the old gymnasium. W.G. Wandschneider describes the old gym well.

Of course, the most humorous of all was the old Westby gym with its Mid-Atlantic corrugated floor with the north basket lower than the south basket due to a heat stack running across the north end. When games with Cashton and Viroqua were played we had about a ten foot path from one basket to the other in which to play. Dribbling was almost impossible due to rotted and loose flooring plus the rolling topography.⁵

Coach Edwin Peterson relates the following: " In a game played at Viola two Westby players received two broken noses and three missing teeth on a jump ball situation."⁶

The records show a forfeited game from Viroqua. It appears that the Viroqua timekeeper insisted the game was over and the Westby timer still had four minutes of play left. Reference was often made to the use of local referees. To remedy this in one game, Westby hired an outside referee, a nephew of the Principal.

Available records of all Westby High School basketball games are recorded in the appendix.

CHAPTER III

GIRLS' BASKETBALL

In 1910, the same year boys' basketball began, girls' basketball was also initiated. George Godfrey was the first coach and one game was played with a group of Westby girls attending high school in Viroqua. The Westby High School girls were victorious by a close score of 6 to 5. The following year, 1911, no games were played. The girls continued to practice under the direction of George Godfrey. Arthur Thorson, a high school student, coached the girls in 1912 and 1913 and they played several games of which there are no records.

Le Roy Peterson coached the girls in 1914, but in the annual the following complaint was registered:

This year has been rather too quiet to satisfy the minds of our wide-awake girls. Only two games have been played, both of them with Ontario High School. Westby over-ran them in both games. The score at Ontario was 5 to 3.⁷

The first woman coach appeared in 1915 when Sulvia Hollingsworth coached a team with a successful record of

six wins and no defeats. From 1916 to 1919 Edna Pease coached the girls, but in 1919 no games were played because of the flu epidemic. The 1920 season was coached by Eileen Bergholte and an interesting score is found wherein Westby defeated Ontario in the first game by a score of 91 to 2 and in the return engagement held Ontario to one point while scoring 41 points themselves. Old timers recall that the girls of this day sewed their own suits and team pictures give evidence of variation in decor.

Girls' basketball continued on an inter-scholastic basis through 1927. Bertha Schoonover coached from 1921 to 1924; Grace Beinhoff coached in 1925 and 1926 and introduced girls' rules in 1925, making it hard to find teams to play. Boys' basketball rules had been used up on till this time. In 1927, the last actual team was coached by Carol Thomson.

Girls' basketball did not die out entirely, as inter-society teams were organized and regular schedules were played. This gave way to the Girls' Athletic Association which is now very active. Their main winter activity is intramural play among teams composed of G.A.A. members.

Available records for all Westby High School girls' basketball games are recorded in the appendix.

CHAPTER IV

FOOTBALL

In the athletic history of Westby High School, football is a relatively new sport and the 1959 season marked the twentieth year of its existence. Through the efforts of W. G. Wandschneider the sport was played as an inter-scholastic event for the first time in 1939. The high school enrollment was over two hundred students at that time so the school board agreed that the school was large enough to support a football team. With economical foresight, Principal Earl C. Knutson insisted that good quality equipment be purchased and much of the original equipment is still being used.

A full seven game schedule was played the first year with "B" teams from area schools. The one "A" game with Viroqua was cancelled due to injuries on the Viroqua team. The following year a seven game schedule was also played and that year marked the beginning of a home and home series with Viroqua. In 1941 Westby became a member of the West Central League which consisted of the following teams: Westby, Mauston, Viroqua, Sparta and Tomah. The year 1941 marked the addition of New Lisbon to the football schedule and this series has been uninterrupted since that date. Westby continued playing football in the West Central League until 1949 when they became a charter member of

the Scenic Central Football League. Four teams originated this league and besides Westby, the other charter members were Hillsboro, Wonewoc and New Lisbon. Muscoda became a member in 1951 but dropped out after three years. Elroy came into the league in 1952, Cashton in 1954 and De Soto in 1955.

Westby won the football championship in 1949, the first year of Scenic Central League play. Championships have also been won in 1952, 1954, 1956, 1957 and 1958. A number of Westby players have been selected as all-conference players. The complete list is as follows: Jack Martine, Arvid Stakston, Arne Borgen, John Nelson, Robert Pederson, Paul Graff, Albert Skaaland, Burton Ekern, Allen Kanable, Daniel Bekkum, James Onshus, Tom Ofte, Fredric Jefson, Robert Flugstad and Ronald Dahlke. In addition Arvid Stakston and Burton Ekern have rated selection on the All-Madison suburban teams. At the 1959 annual athletic banquet, plaques in memory of four all-conference players who have since accidentally met death, were presented by their team mates to the school. The four boys thus commemorated were Luell Neprud, Tom Ofte, Arvid Stakston and Arne Borgen. Space is provided on these plaques to list those voted each year as the most valuable players.

Local interest was increased in 1950 when the city installed lights on the football field making it possible

to play all home games at night.

As previously mentioned, W. G. Wandschneider started football in 1939 and coached through the 1941 season. Arthur Bronson took over the reins in 1942 and 1943, followed by Guerdon Brewer who coached in 1944 and 1945. Since the fall of 1945 Elmo Gulsvig has coached football with the exception of 1949 and 1950 when Robert Hostetler was the mentor.

The history of football has not been without its humorous incidents. W. G. Wandschneider reminisces as follows:

Merritt Goettel was playing fullback for us and was subject to severe leg cramps. In a Logan game he was away for a 90 yard touchdown run. On about the Logan 25 he sat right down with no one around him, got up, took a step or two and sat down again. He⁸ continued this pace until the Logan players were on him.

Arthur Bronson recalls:

It used to bother me when the boys talked Norwegian in the huddle. But on the serious side Bronson added that the Westby boys had the greatest spirit he had ever seen. Some of the boys walked four to five miles home after each practice.⁹

Elmo Gulsvig recalls the first game he coached. One of the tackles was taken out of the game and chastised for some errors. Not knowing that the coach understood Norwegian the player proceeded to give a good tongue lashing in

the Norwegian language. A few plays later Coach Gulsvig asked the tackle in Norwegian if he would like to get back into the game. Needless to say, embarrassment was expressed by the player.

The records for all Westby High School football games are recorded in the appendix.

CHAPTER V

BASEBALL

Baseball in Westby High School has had a history of being an on and off sport. Mention is made of the sport in the early history of the school but no records are available of games played. From 1936 to the start of football in 1939, kittenball was included as an inter-scholastic sport and was played both in the fall and spring. During this time Westby competed in the Monroe-Vernon County League. The following appears in the 1938 annual: "If Westby wins the championship this season they will have won the championship since kittenball was adopted as a sport in 1936."¹⁰

Since 1942 baseball has been played regularly as an inter-scholastic sport and the same year Westby became a member of the Gateway-West Central League. This league comprised teams of the West Central League and Logan High School. The highlight during this period was winning the championship in the spring 1945. This team was coached by Kenneth Hurlbut.

Since 1953 Westby has been a member of the Juneau County Baseball League. In that period four championships

were won in the years 1953, 1954, 1955 and 1958.

As stated earlier in this chapter records are incomplete but those that are available are recorded in the appendix.

CHAPTER VI

TRACK

Track, similar to baseball, has appeared as in interscholastic sport intermittently. As a sport it flourished during the years 1924-1932. Competition was resumed in 1952 and has continued as a regularly scheduled activity.

The main handicap of this sport is the lack of track facilities and consequently all meets have had to be scheduled away from Westby. Despite this fact great interest has been shown in the sport.

Probably the greatest individual competitor developed in track was George Spyier. His most notable accomplishment was scoring 15 points in the state track meets in 1924 and 1925.

Roundy Coughlin in his column has this to say about Spyier:

This kid on that Westby High School track named George Spyier is a boy who should come to Wisconsin under a good coach. This kid should go 24 foot in broad jump while in varsity they will get that out of this kid and he sure can step over them low hurdles in two years he has scored 30 points alone for his school the only points they scored. This boy is a wonder and is big and strong.¹¹

From the Daily Cardinal we quote the following:

Spyier of Westby was easily the individual star of the meet. He took first in the broad jump, discus and the 220 yard low hurdles. His jump of 21 feet 4 inches in the broad jump came within 4 inches of equalling a record of 26 years' standing, made by Kock of Milwaukee west in 1899.¹²

The Milwaukee Sentinel has this to say about the 1925 state track meet:

The most startling feature of the meet was the great work of a lad from the little town of Westby. This youngster, George Spyier, practically single handed gave his school second place in the Class B division and incidentally copied individual honors with 15 points for the second consecutive year. Spyier's three firsts came in the broad jump, discus and low hurdles. His try at the state broad jump mark fell a quarter of an inch short. He cleared 21 feet $7\frac{1}{4}$ inches.¹³

In later year competition the Norsemen have been Juneau County Conference champions twice, in 1957 and 1959. Two boys have participated in the state track meet, namely, Robert Flugstad competed in 1957 and David Meyer in 1959.

Because records are incomplete, the appendix contains only the Westby High School record holders in each of the track and field events.

CHAPTER VII

WRESTLING

Wrestling is the newest sport in the annals of Westby High School Inter-Scholastic athletics. It had its beginning in 1958. Kenneth Trott became the first coach of the sport. A group of twenty boys worked out the first season. Competition was limited to exhibition matches between halves at basketball games and two practice matches with Tomah and Reedsburg.

This past season a schedule of six matches was arranged, two each with Sparta, Tomah and Richland Center. Westby did not win any of the matches but showed increasing ability as the season progressed. The team also competed in the Sectional Meet at Reedsburg.

The first letter winners in wrestling in the history of Westby High School are: Daniel Bekkum, Glen Nelson, David Clemments, Larry Strangstalien, Robert Brye, Jerry Helgerson, and Alan Holte.
